## COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2887

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-41-81, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT SCHOOL BOARDS MAY PURCHASE, OWN AND OPERATE ELECTRIC VEHICLES FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF CHILDREN TO AND FROM PUBLIC SCHOOLS; TO BRING FORWARD SECTIONS 37-41-83, 37-41-85 AND 37-41-101, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH ALLOW FOR THE PURCHASE OF SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT, FOR THE PURPOSE 7 OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 37-41-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

10 amended as follows:

11 37-41-81. The local school boards of this state are hereby 12 authorized and empowered to purchase, own and operate, under such 13 rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the State Board of Education, motor vehicles, electric vehicles and other equipment 14 15 for the transportation of children to and from the public schools 16 of the respective counties and school districts, and to provide 17 for the servicing, repair, care and maintenance of such county or 18 district-owned motor vehicles and to employ drivers for the operation thereof, and to establish, erect and equip school bus 19 20 shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, all under such rules

23 SECTION 2. Section 37-41-83, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
24 brought forward as follows:

25 37-41-83. The school boards are authorized and empowered to 26 expend the necessary amounts from the available transportation 27 funds of the school district for the purchase of such 28 transportation equipment, the servicing, repair and maintenance 29 thereof and for the payment of the salaries of persons employed to 30 drive or operate such transportation equipment, and to establish, 31 erect and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land 32 therefor.

33 SECTION 3. Section 37-41-85, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 34 brought forward as follows:

35 37-41-85. No school board shall purchase any school bus or 36 pupil transportation service vehicle as authorized by Section 37 37-41-81 except in the manner prescribed in Section 37-41-101. No 38 school bus shall be purchased or otherwise acquired which does not 39 conform to the specifications provided by the State Board of 40 Education.

41 SECTION 4. Section 37-41-101, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
42 brought forward as follows:

37-41-101. (1) The State Board of Education is hereby
authorized, empowered and directed to advertise for and receive
sealed bids and proposals for sale of school bus bodies and school

The State Board of Education shall approve persons, firms, corporations or associations authorized to 48 sell school bus bodies and school buses sold as complete units, 49 50 and shall establish prices relative thereto based upon the lowest 51 and best bids, which school districts may not exceed in purchasing such equipment. In determining the lowest and best bids received 52 53 for such equipment, there shall be included as part of the total 54 cost thereof any transportation or freight charges which will be 55 The State Board of Education may permit all such incurred. 56 bidders to sell said equipment provided that the bidders agree to 57 sell the equipment at prices established based upon the lowest and 58 best bid and in compliance with rules and regulations relative 59 thereto promulgated by the state board. Persons, firms, corporations or associations permitted to sell school bus bodies 60 61 and school buses sold as complete units shall be limited to those 62 actually submitting bids for consideration by the State Board of 63 Education. The State Board of Education shall reserve the right 64 to reject any and all bids submitted.

(2) School boards may purchase school bus bodies and school buses sold as complete units without additional advertisement for bids, provided that the prices for such equipment do not exceed the maximum allowable prices established under the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, and that said purchases are in compliance with the conditions specified therein. All such

S. B. No. 2887 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 22/SS26/R1082CS PAGE 3 71 purchases shall be subject to the approval of the State Department 72 of Education, which shall verify compliance with the applicable 73 specifications, rules and regulations promulgated by the State 74 Board of Education.

In addition to the method of purchasing authorized under 75 (3) 76 this section, school boards are hereby authorized to advertise for 77 and accept the lowest and best bid received for the purchase of 78 school bus chassis and/or pupil transportation service vehicles. 79 Provided, however, that local school governing boards may purchase 80 school bus chassis and/or pupil transportation service vehicles 81 from any motor vehicle dealer domiciled within the county of such governing board, whose bid does not exceed a sum equal to three 82 83 percent (3%) greater than the price or cost which the dealer pays the manufacturer, as evidenced by the factory invoice for such 84 vehicles. In the event said county does not have an authorized 85 86 motor vehicle dealer, said board may, in like manner, receive and 87 accept bids from motor vehicle dealers in any adjoining county. No purchase of school bus chassis or service vehicles under the 88 89 provisions of this subsection shall be valid unless the purchase 90 is made according to statutory bidding and licensing requirements. 91 All purchases under provisions of this subsection shall be subject 92 to the approval of the State Department of Education, which shall verify compliance with the applicable specifications, rules and 93 94 regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education.

95 (4) Upon application to and approval by the State Department 96 of Education, school governing boards are hereby authorized to 97 purchase used school buses and used pupil transportation service vehicles, provided that said vehicles meet applicable 98 specifications and the purchase price does not exceed their fair 99 100 market value. Said fair market value shall be determined by an 101 appraisal by three (3) experienced and impartial citizens, the 102 selection of whom shall be mutually agreed upon by the parties 103 thereto. Said appraisers may be subject to approval by the State 104 Department of Education. Maximum regard for pupil safety and 105 adequate protection of health shall be primary requirements which 106 shall be observed by local school governing boards in purchasing 107 used school buses. The State Department of Education may inspect 108 or have inspected any used school bus prior to purchase to determine whether said bus meets requirements of law and 109 110 regulations of the state board.

111 (5) In the event the school board shall have determined that school buses or pupil transportation service vehicles are no 112 113 longer needed for the transportation of pupils in such school 114 district, such equipment may be sold to another school district 115 without the necessity of advertising for bids. The school 116 district proposing to sell the buses or service vehicles and the school district proposing to purchase such equipment shall agree 117 118 upon a fair and reasonable price therefor. The agreement shall be spread upon the minutes of the boards of the respective school 119

124 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 125 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed on June 30, 2022.
