## SENATE BILL NO. 3002

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF 2 STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING FOR SUPPORT OF THE EIGHT 3 UNIVERSITIES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as 5 6 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 7 State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for the purpose 8 9 of support, maintenance, affirmative action plan, interest funds 10 and repairs at the state-supported institutions of higher 11 learning; for support of Alcorn State University, Delta State 12 University, Jackson State University, Mississippi State 13 University, Mississippi University for Women, Mississippi Valley 14 State University, University of Mississippi, and University of Southern Mississippi, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, 15 and ending June 30, 2023 ..... \$ 301,607,711.00. 16 SECTION 2. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as 17 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the proceeds from 18

19	any federal, student fees or other special source funds not
20	otherwise appropriated, to the Board of Trustees of State
21	Institutions of Higher Learning for the purpose of support of
22	education and general operations of Alcorn State University, Delta
23	State University, Jackson State University, Mississippi State
24	University, Mississippi University for Women, Mississippi Valley
25	State University, University of Mississippi, and University of
26	Southern Mississippi, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022,
27	and ending June 30, 2023 \$ 947,724,271.00.
28	SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may be
29	necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any money in the Ayers
30	Endowment Interest Fund, State Treasury Fund No. 3325800000, for
31	the purposes as set out by the courts in the Ayers Case for the
32	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023:
33	Alcorn State University\$ 254,700.00
34	Jackson State University\$ 390,600.00
35	Mississippi Valley State University\$ 254,700.00
36	SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
37	Section 2, the amount of One Million Six Hundred Fifteen Thousand
38	Nine Hundred Three Dollars (\$1,615,903.00) shall be derived from
39	unexpended balances in the Ayers program funds provided for the
40	purpose in prior-year appropriations enacted by The Mississippi
41	Legislature. These funds are to be allocated as follows:
42	Jackson State University\$ 1,165,697.00
43	Alcorn State University\$ 3,275.00

Mississippi Valley State University\$ 446,931.00
SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall
allocate funds to the off-campus centers based on a minimum rate
of sixty-five percent (65%) of the on-campus cost of a full-time
equivalent student. The on-campus distribution is to be
determined without regard to the costs incurred by any one or more
of them in the operation of off-campus degree-completing centers'
classes. Off-campus centers which are operated jointly by two (2)
or more institutions, the amount allocated to such centers shall
be prorated among the institutions jointly operating such centers
based on the full-time equivalent enrollment of such centers.
The board of trustees shall ensure that the off-campus
centers are not charged with any indirect or overhead cost
prorated from any on-campus activity. It is the intention of the
Legislature that the on-campus operations charge the off-campus
centers with only actual direct charges.
SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
act, the amount of One Hundred Forty-five Thousand Dollars
(\$145,000.00) shall be used for the promotion and expenses of the
Mississippi Governor's School for the Gifted and Talented.
Provided, however, that the Board of Trustees of State
Institutions of Higher Learning shall develop the governing policy
for faculty, course content and facilities selection on a
competitive basis from all Mississippi senior colleges and

69	universities. The Mississippi Governor's School for the Gifted
70	and Talented shall accept not less than one (1) high school
71	student nominee from each accredited high school in Mississippi.
72	The nominees, selected under criteria developed and adopted by the
73	Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, shall
74	be provided a two-week tuition-free program.
75	SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
76	act, the amount of Three Hundred Forty-nine Thousand Two Hundred
77	Dollars (\$349,200.00) shall be used for the promotion and expenses
78	of the Teacher Corps.
79	SECTION 8. It is the intent of the Legislature that no
80	general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to
81	replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being
82	used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and
83	which are withdrawn and no longer available.
84	SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
85	act, the following amounts shall be used as set forth:

108	SECTION 1	0. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2	of this

118	SECTION 11.	It is the intention of the Legislature that the
119	Board of Trustees	of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall
120	first use special	funds to the greatest extent possible to defray
121	the costs of prov	iding remediation at the state-supported
122	institutions of h	igher learning.

123 SECTION 12. None of the funds appropriated by this act shall 124 be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or 125 necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the Board 126 of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, or any of 127 the powers or duties of any institution under the jurisdiction of 128 the board of trustees, that are authorized by the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or 129 130 regulations that implement state or federal law.

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the budget requests of the institutions for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process.

SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning continue to review, and eliminate when possible, duplicating programs and degrees in the existing institutions of higher learning in this state.

SECTION 15. No state appropriations or student tuition and fee receipts, except those specifically charged for the provision

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143	of the services, shall be used to support auxiliary enterprises,
144	with the exception of intercollegiate athletics at a level
145	designated by the board of trustees. It is the intent of the
146	Legislature that auxiliary enterprises shall be self-supporting
147	and that deficits not be taken from funds intended for instruction
148	and academic programs.
149	SECTION 16. The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of
150	Higher Learning shall report yearly to the Legislature the
151	institution compliance with Section 97-11-51, Mississippi Code of
152	1972, which prohibits deficit spending.
153	SECTION 17. Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and
154	paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be
155	in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of
156	Mississippi and Section 25-4-105, Mississippi Code of 1972.
157	SECTION 18. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
158	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
159	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
160	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
161	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
162	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
163	performance measures provided below:

186	SECTION 19. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of
187	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following
188	amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated
189	equally to Jackson State University, Mississippi State University,
190	the University of Mississippi, and the University of Southern
191	Mississippi for economic development, reorganization, and
192	relocation of efforts at those universities\$ 2,000,000.00.

193	SECTION 20. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of
194	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following
195	amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated
196	to Mississippi State University - Meridian
197	Branch\$ 900,000.00.
198	SECTION 21. It is the intention of the Legislature that
199	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
200	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
201	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
202	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
203	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
204	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
205	made without competitive bids.
206	SECTION 22. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of
207	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following
208	amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated
209	to Jackson State University E-Learning Center\$ 485,000.00.
210	SECTION 23. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of
211	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following
212	amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated
213	to the Delta State University
214	E-Learning Center\$ 155,000.00.
215	SECTION 24. It is the intent of the Legislature that at the
216	end of Fiscal Year 2023 any unexpended balances in Ayers programs
217	funds established pursuant to this act shall not lapse into the

218	State General Fund, but shall carry over and be available for
219	expenditure in the succeeding fiscal year, and subject to
220	Legislative appropriation.
221	SECTION 25. None of the State General Funds appropriated by
222	this act shall be expended for the purpose of travel outside the
223	United States.
224	SECTION 26. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of
225	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following
226	sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated to
227	Delta State University Department of Commercial Aviation
228	\$ 800,000.00.
229	SECTION 27. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and
230	Section 2 of this act, One Hundred Ninety-one Thousand Six Hundred
231	Ten Dollars (\$191,610.00) is provided for geospatial site
232	licenses.
233	SECTION 28. It is the intention of the Legislature that none
234	of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain
235	utilities for state-furnished housing for any employees. Such
236	utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane,
237	cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined,
238	the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance
239	with legislative intent. Such state-furnished housing shall
240	include single-family and multifamily residences but shall not
241	include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities
242	shall be prohibited.

243	SECTION 29. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of
244	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following
245	amount shall be allocated to the Delta State University Delta
246	Center for Culture and Learning\$ 100,000.00.
247	The funds allocated in this section shall only be used for
248	the Delta Center for Culture and Learning.
249	SECTION 30. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of
250	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following
251	amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated
252	to fund the Washington Center for Internships and Academic
253	Seminars Mississippi Initiative Scholarship Program
254	\$ 75 <b>,</b> 000.00.
255	This program will provide opportunities for Mississippi's
256	university and college students to gain real-life experience
257	working in Washington, D.C. The funding will provide scholarships
258	at Alcorn State University, Delta State University, Jackson State
259	University, Mississippi State University, Mississippi University
260	for Women, Mississippi Valley State University, the University of
261	Mississippi, and the University of Southern Mississippi. A
262	written report shall be submitted listing the scholarship
263	recipients by university to the Chairmen and members of the Senate
264	and House Appropriations Committees.
265	SECTION 31. None of the funds appropriated and/or authorized
266	for expenditure under this act shall be used for research in which
267	a human embryo is killed or destroyed.

- SECTION 32. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
  of Section 1 of this act, an amount not more than One Hundred
  Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000.00) shall be allocated to
  implement university system efficiencies, including, but not
  limited to, academic, space, energy and any other system projects
  or expenditures that would lead to improved efficiency. Such
  funds may also be used to draw down other funds or as matching
- SECTION 33. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1 of this act, Eighty-seven Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$87,300.00) shall be used to defray the expenses of the Children's Center for Communication and Development at the University of Southern Mississippi.
- SECTION 34. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, the amount of Two Hundred Forty-two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$242,500.00) is provided for defraying the expenses of the DuBard School.
- SECTION 35. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
  of Section 1 of this act, Two Hundred Sixty-six Thousand Seven
  Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$266,750.00) is provided for the Southwest
  Mississippi Center for Culture and Learning at Alcorn State
  University.
- 290 **SECTION 36.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 291 act, it is the intention of the Legislature that Eight Hundred 292 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$850,000.00) is provided for the Engineer

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funds.

- 293 Research and Development Center in Vicksburg, Mississippi, for
- 294 Research and Development opportunities in Science and Technology
- 295 initiatives.
- 296 **SECTION 37.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 297 act, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) is provided for
- 298 the Delta State University Delta Music Institute.
- 299 **SECTION 38.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 300 Mississippi Valley State University is authorized to provide water
- 301 or sewer service to any existing, privately-owned structures that
- 302 presently take water or sewer service from Mississippi Valley
- 303 State University. Furthermore, Mississippi Valley State
- 304 University is authorized to charge a flat or metered rate for the
- 305 service provided. Mississippi Valley State University shall not
- 306 provide any water or sewer service to any new, privately-owned
- 307 structures.
- 308 **SECTION 39.** Of the funds herein appropriated, Seven Hundred
- 309 Twenty-nine Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$729,890.00)
- 310 shall be provided to the Charter School Authorizer Board. Of this
- 311 amount, Two Hundred Twenty-nine Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety
- 312 Dollars (\$229,890.00) shall be provided in General Funds and Five
- 313 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) shall be provided in
- 314 Special Funds from the Charter School Authorizer Board Fund Fund
- 315 No. 3001700000.
- 316 **SECTION 40.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 317 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with

318	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
319	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
320	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
321	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
322	actions contrary to this provision.
323	SECTION 41. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
324	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
325	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
326	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
327	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
328	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
329	SECTION 42. This act shall take effect and be in force from
330	and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after
331	June 30, 2022.
