SENATE BILL NO. 3014
(As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE
2 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

4 **SECTION 1.** The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State
6 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the expenses of
7 the Department of Public Safety for the fiscal year beginning
8 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.....\$ 137,913,293.00.

9 **SECTION 2.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
10 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
11 to the credit of the Department of Public Safety for the purpose
12 of defraying the expenses incurred in the operation of the various
13 divisions of the department for the fiscal year beginning
14 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.....\$ 138,658,412.00.

15 **SECTION 3.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
16 this act, the following positions are authorized:

17 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

18 Permanent: 1,771



19 Time-Limited: 80

20 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
21 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
22 Services for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 funds
23 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
24 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the Mississippi
25 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
26 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the
27 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
28 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
29 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
30 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
31 Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the
32 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023
33 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
34 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
35 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

36 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
37 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
38 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
39 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
40 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
41 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
42 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions



43 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
44 appropriated level.

45 No General Funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
46 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
47 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
48 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

49 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
50 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
51 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
52 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

53 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
54 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
55 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
56 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
57 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
58 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

59 **SECTION 4.** The Commissioner of Public Safety may, on a
60 case-by-case basis, within funds available, recommend that
61 corrective salary adjustments be made to the compensation of
62 employees of the Department of Public Safety where an inequity was
63 created between employees of equivalent capacity by previous
64 application of the agency appropriation acts. Any such corrective
65 salary adjustment plan must have prior approval by the State
66 Personnel Board. Such adjustments will not be retroactive.



67 Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe Benefits major
68 object of expenditure may be used to purchase accumulated
69 compensatory time within funds available.

70 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature, that the
71 Department of Public Safety shall receive Five Million Dollars
72 (\$5,000,000.00) from the Mississippi Department of Transportation,
73 for the operations of the Office of Commercial Transportation
74 Enforcement Division that was authorized to be relocated in Senate
75 Bill 2825, 2021 Regular Session.

76 **SECTION 6.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the
77 local governments pay for part of the computer cost of the
78 Mississippi Justice Information Center by maintaining their
79 contribution to the Department of Public Safety.

80 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
81 Department of Public Safety designate certain employees to aid the
82 Office of Forensics Laboratories in the billing and collecting of
83 all fees charged for services rendered by the Office of Forensics
84 Laboratories.

85 **SECTION 8.** No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be
86 transferred to, expended by, or used, directly or indirectly, for
87 the benefit of any public relations, publicity or publication
88 activities of any other state agency, department or officer, nor
89 shall any personnel paid with funds appropriated herein be
90 transferred or assigned to any other state agency, department or



91 officer for public relations, publicity, or publication activities
92 of such office.

93 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
94 Department of Public Safety shall not issue citations for
95 violations of speed limits on a quota basis. No funds expended
96 under this act shall be used for such quota-based citations for
97 violations of speed limits.

98 **SECTION 10.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
99 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
100 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
101 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
102 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
103 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
104 performance measures provided below:

265 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that all
266 divisions within the Mississippi Department of Public Safety shall
267 maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the
268 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such
269 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as
270 maintained for Fiscal Year 2022. It is further the intention of
271 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year
272 2024 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee
273 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level
274 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request
275 process.

276 **SECTION 12.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
277 of Section 2 of this act, funds may be expended to defray the
278 costs of clothing for sworn nonuniform law enforcement officers in
279 an amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) annually
280 per officer.

281 **SECTION 13.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
282 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
283 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
284 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
285 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
286 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
287 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
288 made without competitive bids.



289 **SECTION 14.** The department is authorized to expend available
290 funds on technology or equipment upgrades or replacements when it
291 will generate savings through efficiency or when the savings
292 generated from such upgrades or replacements exceed expenditures
293 thereof.

294 **SECTION 15.** Of the funds provided herein, and in addition to
295 the One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) authorized in Section 45-3-7,
296 Mississippi Code of 1972, Department of Public Safety Officers who
297 are licensed commercial pilots shall receive an additional Nine
298 Hundred Dollars (\$900.00), for a total of One Thousand Dollars
299 (\$1,000.00), additional compensation for such service.

300 **SECTION 16.** It is the direction of the Legislature that all
301 Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) nonexempt sworn officers of the
302 Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol who are working one hundred
303 seventy-one (171) hours in a twenty-eight-day work cycle be
304 compensated based on the annual salary established by the State
305 Personnel Board for a one-hundred-sixty-hour per month schedule
306 divided by two thousand eighty-seven and one hundred forty-three
307 one thousandths (2,087.143), for an hourly rate, to be multiplied
308 by two thousand two hundred twenty-three (2,223) or one hundred
309 seventy-one (171) hours in a twenty-eight-day work cycle for a new
310 annual salary. All hours worked over one hundred seventy-one
311 (171) hours in a twenty-eight-day schedule shall be governed by
312 the FLSA or other special compensation plan. All realignments



313 after July 1, 2010, shall be calculated using this formula. This
314 section shall be known as the "David R. Huggins Act."

315 **SECTION 17.** Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2 of
316 this act, Four Hundred Ninety-five Thousand One Hundred Ninety
317 Dollars (\$495,190.00) is appropriated out of any funds in the
318 State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Public Safety
319 for the purposes of paying for eleven (11) hours of compensatory
320 time at an hourly rate based on two thousand eighty-seven and one
321 hundred forty-three one thousandths (2,087.143) hours per year for
322 sworn officers who hold the rank of Lieutenant and above. The
323 funds provided in this section to pay for the eleven (11) hours
324 authorized in this section shall be expended only for this
325 purpose.

326 **SECTION 18.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
327 Department of Public Safety shall provide an annual report to the
328 Mississippi Legislature detailing any elected official or any
329 other person who is not an employee of the Department of Public
330 Safety who was transported in Highway Patrol aircraft during the
331 fiscal year. The report shall be provided to each member of the
332 Mississippi Legislature on or before January 15, 2023.

333 **SECTION 19.** The Commissioner of Public Safety shall have the
334 authority to transfer any funds from any division within the
335 Department of Public Safety to any other division of the
336 Department of Public Safety Special Funds, including, but not
337 limited to, Funds 3711, 371C, 371E, 3713, 3714, 3715, 3740, 3741,



338 3742, 3744, 3747 and 3718, not to exceed Twenty Million Dollars
339 (\$20,000,000.00) collectively during Fiscal Year 2023. However,
340 none of the funds appropriated by this act shall be expended
341 unless the Department of Public Safety provides prior written
342 notification of any transfer of funds provided in this section.

343 **SECTION 20.** The Bureau of Narcotics is authorized to expend
344 a sum, not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00)
345 from account No. 3371800000, for purposes of effectuating the
346 provisions of House Bill 812, 2017 Regular Session, Section 1 of
347 this act. Expenditures authorized by this section may include,
348 but not be limited to, costs associated with contracting with one
349 or more vendors, contractors or other persons or entities to
350 create, operate and maintain the forfeiture website and to provide
351 continuing support in relation thereto. In the event an amount
352 less than Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) is required to
353 effectuate the purposes of this section, the Bureau is authorized
354 to expend the remainder of such authorized funds for the purchase
355 of commodities, vehicles and/or other equipment necessary in the
356 furtherance of the needs of the Bureau.

357 **SECTION 21.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
358 act, it is the intention of the Legislature that Four Million
359 Three Hundred Twelve Thousand Six Hundred Two Dollars
360 (\$4,312,602.00) may be allocated for the programs supported from
361 General Fund court assessments as follows:

376 **SECTION 22.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
377 Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics, Mississippi Department of Public
378 Safety, shall have the authority to receive, budget and expend
379 special funds from the Drug Evidence Disposition Funds
380 (3372000000), not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
381 (\$500,000.00).

382 **SECTION 23.** Of the funds appropriated by this act, pursuant
383 to House Bill No 571, 2019 Regular Session, Two Hundred Fifty
384 Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided for the duties and
385 operations of a Statewide Human Trafficking Coordinator and a data
386 analyst within the Bureau of Investigation in the Department of
387 Public Safety, who shall coordinate all statewide activities and



388 work with the Department of Child Protection Services for all
389 victims recovered.

390 **SECTION 24.** Of the funds appropriated by this act, pursuant
391 to House Bill 1283, 2019 Regular Session, Two Hundred Forty-two
392 Thousand Six Hundred Three dollars (\$242,603.00) is provided for
393 the duties and operations associated with the Mississippi School
394 Safety Act of 2019.

395 **SECTION 25.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
396 of Section 2 of this act, Six Million Seven Hundred Thousand
397 Dollars (\$6,700,000.00), or so much thereof, shall be derived out
398 of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital
399 Expense Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code
400 of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the State
401 Treasurer. These funds are provided to the Department of Public
402 Safety for the upgrade of the Driver Services IDEMIA System.

403 **SECTION 26.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
404 of Section 2 of this act, Two Million Four Hundred Eighty Thousand
405 Dollars (\$2,480,000.00), or so much thereof, shall be derived out
406 of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital
407 Expense Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code
408 of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the State
409 Treasurer. These funds are provided to the Department of Public
410 Safety for the capital facilities, equipment, and other
411 operational needs.



412 **SECTION 27.** (1) Of the funds appropriated under the
413 provisions of Section 2 of this act, the following sum, or so much
414 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any
415 money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Coronavirus State
416 Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated to the credit of
417 the Department of Public Safety.....\$ 15,535,000.00.

418 These funds are provided for the purpose of completing
419 capital projects at state-owned buildings or grounds, crime
420 prevention due to the increase in crime, and operational
421 expenditures necessary to respond to the effects of the COVID-19
422 pandemic as allowable under Section 9901 of the American Rescue
423 Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) or any guidance or regulation issued by
424 the United States Department of the Treasury in conformity
425 therewith.

426 (2) None of the funds provided under this section shall be
427 used to pay employee premium payments.

428 (3) The agency shall not disburse any funds provided under
429 this section to any recipient without first: (a) making an
430 individualized determination that the reimbursement sought is, in
431 the agency's independent judgment, for necessary expenditures
432 eligible under Section 602 of the federal Social Security Act as
433 added by Section 9901 of the federal American Rescue Plan Act of
434 2021 (ARPA) and its implementing guidelines, guidance, rules,
435 regulations and/or other criteria, as may be amended or
436 supplemented from time to time, by the United States Department of



437 the Treasury; and (b) determining that the recipient has not
438 received and will not receive reimbursement for the expense in
439 question from any source of funds, including insurance proceeds,
440 other than those funds provided under Section 602 of the federal
441 Social Security Act as added by Section 9901 of ARPA. In
442 addition, the agency shall ensure that all funds provided under
443 this section are disbursed in compliance with the Single Audit Act
444 (31 USC Sections 7501-7507) and the related provisions of the
445 Uniform Guidance, 2 CFR Section 200.303 regarding internal
446 controls, Sections 200.330 through 200.332 regarding sub-recipient
447 monitoring and management, and subpart F regarding audit
448 requirements.

449 (4) As a condition of receiving and expending the funds
450 provided to the agency under this section, the agency shall
451 certify to the Department of Finance and Administration that each
452 expenditure of the funds provided to the agency under this section
453 complies with the guidelines, guidance, rules, regulations and/or
454 other criteria, as may be amended from time to time, of the United
455 States Department of the Treasury regarding the use of monies from
456 the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by ARPA.

457 (5) If the Office of Inspector General of the United States
458 Department of the Treasury, or the Office of Inspector General of
459 any other federal agency having oversight over the use of monies
460 from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by
461 ARPA (a) determines that the agency or recipient has expended or



462 otherwise used any of the funds provided to the agency under this
463 section for any purpose that is not in compliance with the
464 guidelines, guidance, rules, regulations and/or other criteria, as
465 may be amended from time to time, of the United States Department
466 of the Treasury regarding the use of monies from the Coronavirus
467 State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by the ARPA, and (b) the
468 State of Mississippi is required to repay the federal government
469 for any of those funds that the Office of the Inspector General
470 determined were expended or otherwise used improperly by the
471 agency or recipient, then the agency or recipient that expended or
472 otherwise used those funds improperly shall be required to pay the
473 amount of those funds to the State of Mississippi for repayment to
474 the federal government.

475 (6) Of the funds provided under this section, Four Million
476 Dollars (\$4,000,000.00) is provided for the backlog of autopsies
477 at the Mississippi Forensic Laboratory, which includes the
478 Mississippi Forensics Laboratory and the Office of the State
479 Medical Examiner.

480 **SECTION 28.** The department may subgrant a portion of the
481 funds appropriated herein to the Jackson Police Department for
482 eligible activities contingent upon the execution of an
483 operational agreement between the Capitol Police and Jackson
484 Police Department on roles and responsibilities within the Capitol
485 Complex Improvement District.



486 **SECTION 29.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
487 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital
488 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Department of
489 Public Safety for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of
490 Capital Expense Funds, as authorized in SB 2916, 2021 Regular
491 Session to provide for repairs and renovations at the Department
492 of Public Safety Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers Training

496 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
497 exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 2022.

498 **SECTION 30.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
499 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital
500 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Department of
501 Public Safety for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of
502 Capital Expense Funds, as authorized in SB 2916, 2021 Regular
503 Session to provide for Bullet Proof Vests Program at the
504 Department of Public Safety for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
505 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.....\$ 93,750.00.

506 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the
507 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
508 exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 2022.



509 **SECTION 31.** With the funds appropriated herein, the
510 Department of Public Safety is authorized to make payment for

519 **SECTION 32.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
520 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

523 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
524 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
