## SENATE BILL NO. 3015

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE, FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and
9	Commerce, including the Divisions of Support, Plant Industry,
10	Farmers Central Market, Fair Commission, Livestock Coliseum,
11	Industrial Showcase, and Trade Mart Building, for the fiscal year
12	beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
13	\$ 8,422,827.00.
14	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
15	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
16	source funds, which are collected by or otherwise become available
17	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department
18	of Agriculture and Commerce, including the Divisions of Support

19	and Plant Industry, Farmers Central Market, Fair Commission,
20	Livestock Coliseum, Industrial Showcase, and Trade Mart Building
21	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending
22	June 30, 2023 \$ 12,468,036.00.
23	The funds authorized for expenditure under the provisions of
24	this section include subscription fees produced from the Market
25	Bulletin and admission fees produced from the Mississippi
26	Agriculture and Forestry Museum.
27	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
28	this act, the following positions are authorized:

30	Permanent: Full Time 206

34	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
35	responsibility to make certain that funds required for "Personal
36	Services" for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023
37	funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions
38	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the
39	Mississippi Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the
40	agency's personal services appropriation, which shall be published
41	by the State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel
42	Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll
43	costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility

- 44 of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures
- 45 for Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the
- 46 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023
- 47 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
- 48 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
- 49 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 51 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 52 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 53 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 54 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 55 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 56 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 57 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 58 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 60 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 61 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 62 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 64 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 65 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 66 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 68 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered



69	under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
70	Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
71	funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
72	minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
73	SECTION 4. In addition to all other sums herein
74	appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
75	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
76	Treasury to the credit of the Beaver Control Program or from any
77	other special source funds made available to the Beaver Control
78	Program, to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the
79	support of the Beaver Control Program for the fiscal year
80	beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
81	\$ 1,100,000.00
82	Of the special funds authorized in this section, Six Hundred
83	Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$650,000.00) shall be derived from funds
84	received from the Mississippi Department of Transportation and
85	from fees charged private persons/organizations, and Two Hundred
86	Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) shall be derived from funds
87	received from the State Forestry Commission. A county in order to
88	participate must pay up to Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars
89	(\$7,500.00) and if any county wishes to pay any additional funds
90	than provided, those funds may be used only in said county.
91	SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the

191	SECTION 8. The funds appropriated and authorize	ed to be
192	expended under the provisions of this act shall be ex	pended for
193	the purpose of defraying all expenses incurred by the	State

194 Department of Agriculture and Commerce in the operation of all 195 programs and activities (except operation of the State Lime 196 Plants, Veterinary Laboratory, Pink Bollworm-Plant Quarantine 197 Inspection Stations and Fire Ant Program) authorized to be 198 conducted and carried on by said department; including, but not 199 limited to: the administration of the Feed, Fertilizer and Dairy 200 Act; the Weights and Measures Act; the Meat Inspection Act of 201 1968; the Mississippi Pure Seed Law; and the following additional 202 programs and activities: enforcement of the egg law; publication 203 and distribution of the Mississippi Market Bulletin, agricultural 204 statistics, market news service at Stoneville, Mississippi; and 205 inspection, grading and certifying of fruits, vegetables, hay, 206 grain, meat and meat products, milk and dairy products, pecans, 207 seed and syrup.

SECTION 9. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, with the assistance of the State Department of Audit and the Department of Finance and Administration, shall establish nonbudgeted enterprise funds for all "for-profit" activities related to the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. The funds shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and regulations prescribed by the Department of Finance and Administration.

SECTION 10. Of the funds provided by the provisions of this act, it is the intent of the Legislature that not more than Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) shall be expended for the

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Mississippi Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Pilot Program, which
shall be established by the State Department of Agriculture and
Commerce to serve senior citizens above sixty (60) years of age
who fall within one hundred thirty percent (130%) of the poverty
level. The Commissioner of Agriculture may promulgate rules and
regulations necessary to implement the Mississippi Senior Farmers'
Market Nutrition Pilot Program.

whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Agriculture and Commerce shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2022. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process.

SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after
June 30, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after June 30,
2022.
