SENATE BILL NO. 3016

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF 2 AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES 3 OF THE DIXIE NATIONAL LIVESTOCK SHOW; A ROUNDUP FOR JUNIOR EXHIBITORS OF LIVESTOCK AND GOATS; SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDS FOR 5 LIVESTOCK PREMIUMS; COUNTY LIVESTOCK SHOWS IN OFFERING AND PAYING 6 PRIZES OR AWARDS TO COMPETITORS IN APPROVED COUNTY LIVESTOCK 7 SHOWS; THE FIVE DISTRICT LIVESTOCK SHOWS; THE FIVE STATE DAIRY 8 SHOWS; THE MISSISSIPPI HIGH SCHOOL RODEO; AND TO PROVIDE HOW SAID 9 MONEY SHALL BE PAID OUT OF THE STATE TREASURY FOR FISCAL YEAR 10 2023. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 12 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 13 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department of Agriculture and 14 15 Commerce's special fund account, to the State Department of 16 Agriculture and Commerce for the purposes of defraying the costs 17 of prizes, premiums, judges and other actual and necessary costs of putting on the Dixie National Livestock Show at the State 18 Fairgrounds in Jackson, Mississippi, for the fiscal year beginning 19 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.....\$ 954,150.00. 20 21 SECTION 2. The following sums, or so much thereof as may be 22 necessary, are appropriated out of any money in the State General

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23	Fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the State Department of
24	Agriculture and Commerce as follows:
25	(a) For the support of annual roundup shows for junior
26	exhibitors of junior steers, junior breeding cattle, beef cattle,
27	dairy cattle, hogs, sheep and goats, for the fiscal year beginning
28	July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023\$ 54,066.00.
29	(b) To supplement the funds paid by the State
30	Department of Agriculture and Commerce for livestock premiums at
31	the State Fair, all livestock premiums to be paid on the American
32	system of judging (1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, etc.) on all classes
33	entered in the senior division for the fiscal year beginning
34	July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023\$ 18,565.00.
35	(c) For the county livestock shows in offering and
36	paying prizes or awards to competitors in the approved county
37	livestock shows of Mississippi, for the fiscal year beginning
38	July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023\$ 12,644.00.
39	Provided, however, that of the amount herein appropriated in
40	paragraph (c), not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00)
41	shall be expended or used in any one (1) county of the state
42	during each fiscal year. Provided, further, that none of the
43	monies herein appropriated in paragraph (c) shall be used in
44	offering or paying prizes or awards for any livestock show that is
45	not held where there are adequate barns, pens and other facilities
46	available for such a show.

47	Provided, further, in paragraph (c) that the management of
48	such shows shall be in the hands of a county livestock
49	association, and such association shall guarantee a minimum amount
50	of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to be used in the paying of
51	prizes, premiums or awards, and after said county show has been
52	held and premiums paid, fifty percent (50%) of the amount, not
53	exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), shall be paid upon
54	requisition to the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce.
55	Provided, further, in paragraph (c) that in any county which
56	has two (2) shows with proper facilities, and a contiguous county
57	has no such fair and desires to participate in a fair to be held
58	in an adjoining county, each of the two (2) fairs in one (1)
59	county may receive an equal proportion of the funds hereby
60	appropriated, provided, both shows shall not receive an aggregate
61	sum of more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
62	(d) For the purpose of offering awards and prizes to
63	competitors in the five (5) district livestock shows, for the
64	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
65	\$ 54,585.00.
66	(e) For the purpose of offering awards and prizes to
67	competitors in the five (5) state dairy shows as provided in
68	Section 69-5-101 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal
69	year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
70	\$ 7 , 066.00.

71 Provided, further, that no part of the money herein 72 appropriated under the provisions of paragraphs (d) and (e) shall 73 be used for any other purpose than to pay premium awards at said 74 shows and state shows and expositions receiving legislative 75 appropriation shall not conflict in dates in order that livestock 76 exhibitors may make the circuit of shows. Provided, further, that 77 none of the above-mentioned funds shall be paid to any district 78 shows unless shows are held prior to roundup.

Not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the funds herein appropriated under the provisions of paragraphs (d) and (e) shall be used in awarding prizes or premiums to 4-H Club members and Smith-Hughes School members and other boys and girls having entries in said shows.

All funds herein appropriated under the provisions of paragraphs (d) and (e) for the five (5) district livestock shows and the five (5) fall state dairy shows shall be distributed in such manner that the livestock exhibitors will each draw equal premium awards for comparable grades and placings at each of the said five (5) district spring shows and the five (5) fall state The management of each district spring show and each state fall show shall submit to the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce, within fifteen (15) days after the close of each said show, a full report on the number of exhibitors at each said show, with the grades and placings of the different classes of livestock exhibited.

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96	The State Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, together
97	with a committee of three (3) to be named by the President of the
98	Mississippi Livestock Council from that organization, shall
99	summarize and prepare a unified list of awards for like classes in
100	all spring district livestock shows and fall state dairy shows
101	receiving state premium money, as authorized in paragraphs (d) and
102	(e). The State Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce shall
103	approve and present a requisition to the State Fiscal Officer for
104	the payment of the amount of funds in paragraphs (d) and (e) due
105	each show and said State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrant
106	thereon, and it shall be paid by the State Treasurer.
107	Provided, however, as a condition of expenditure of the funds

Provided, however, as a condition of expenditure of the funds appropriated in paragraphs (d) and (e), that the board of directors of any district livestock show may, in its discretion, choose to hold its show in the fall instead of the spring. If district shows are held in both spring and fall, then all funds herein appropriated for the five (5) district livestock shows shall be distributed in such a manner that the spring livestock exhibitors will each draw equal premium awards for comparable grades and placings at each district spring show, and the fall livestock exhibitors will each draw equal premium awards for comparable grades and placings at each district fall show.

125	SECTION 3. Of the funds in Section 2, any funds that are
126	remaining at the end of the fiscal year may be transferred between
127	the different show awards and prize monies, with the exception
128	that no county show in paragraph (c) shall receive more than One
129	Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
130	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that
131	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
132	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
133	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
134	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
135	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
136	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
137	made without competitive bids.
138	SECTION 5. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
139	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
140	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
141	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
142	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
143	proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after June 30, 2022.
