SENATE BILL NO. 3017

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF 2 ANIMAL HEALTH FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE 3 BOARD FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Board of Animal Health 8 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending 9 June 30, 2023.....\$ 1,310,437.00. 10 11 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special 12 13 source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available 14 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Board of Animal Health, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and 15 ending June 30, 2023.....\$ 758,857.00. 16 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 17 18 this act, the following positions are authorized:

24 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required for "Personal 25 Services" for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 26 27 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the 28 29 Mississippi Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the 30 agency's personal services appropriation, which shall be published 31 by the State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel 32 Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll 33 costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility 34 of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures 35 for Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 36 37 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions 38 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception 39 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency. 40 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 41 42 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State

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Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written

44 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 45 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 46 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 47 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 48 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

53 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in 54 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating 55 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as 56 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

57 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of 58 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered 59 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation 60 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the 61 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the 62 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

63 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that 64 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 65 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 66 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 67 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 68 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to

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71 The Mississippi Board of Animal Health is SECTION 5. 72 authorized to accept and expend any grant, donation, or 73 contribution from any individual, public or private organization, 74 or government entity for purposes of defraying the operational costs of the department. Such grants, donations or contributions 75 76 shall be received and expended under the rules and regulations of 77 the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner 78 consistent with the escalation of federal funds not to exceed Five 79 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00).

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

87 SECTION 7. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 88 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 89 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 90 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 91 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 92 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

93 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from 94 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after 95 June 30, 2022.
