SENATE BILL NO. 3018

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE 2 MISSISSIPPI EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY, AND FOR THE PURPOSE OF 3 ESTABLISHING A DISASTER RELIEF RESERVE FUND AND DEFRAYING THE 4 COSTS RELATED TO CERTAIN DISASTER ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS FOR FISCAL 5 YEAR 2023.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State 8 9 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of 10 defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-15-1 et 11 12 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023..... \$ 13 3,996,691.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 14 15 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special 16 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi 17 Emergency Management Agency which is comprised of special source 18 funds collected by or otherwise available to the agency, for the

19 support and maintenance of the agency for the fiscal year 20 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023..... 21\$ 26,711,221.00. 22 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 23 the following positions are authorized: 24 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: Full Time 25 Permanent: 113 26 Part Time 0 27 Time-Limited: Full Time 69 28 Part Time 0

29 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required for "Personal 30 31 Services" for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 32 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions 33 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the 34 Mississippi Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the 35 agency's personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel 36 Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll 37 38 costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures 39 40 for Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 41 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions 42

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shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exceptionof new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

45 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 46 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 47 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 48 49 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 50 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 51 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 52 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 53 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

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SECTION 4. 68 In addition to all other sums herein appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 69 70 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 71 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi 72 Emergency Management Agency for the purpose of defraying certain 73 administrative expenses and the state share of the cost of 74 disaster assistance programs, including, but not being limited to, public assistance programs, individual and family grant programs, 75 76 and mitigation programs, for the fiscal year beginning 77 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.....\$ 585,056.00.

78 SECTION 5. In addition to all other sums herein 79 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 80 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Emergency Management 81 Agency Fund Nos. 3725, 3728, 372U, 3729, 37AH, 6820174300, and 82 83 58202 for the purpose of defraying certain administrative expenses 84 and the state and federal share of the cost of disaster assistance programs, including, but not being limited to, public assistance 85 86 programs, individual and family grant programs, and mitigation 87 programs, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending 88 June 30, 2023\$ 356,788,307.00. 89 SECTION 6. The funds appropriated under the provisions of 90 Sections 4 and 5 of this act are provided to defray certain

91 administrative expenses and the state and federal share of the 92 cost of disaster assistance programs, including public assistance

126 **SECTION 7.** None of the funds appropriated in Section 4 shall 127 be used to establish a special reserve fund in the State Treasury 128 for disaster relief except as provided for in Section 33-15-307, 129 Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 130 131 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency may, upon 132 the request of a local public emergency management organization in 133 an area which has suffered a natural disaster, supply equipment to 134 rural water associations to enable their continued operation when 135 the local emergency management organization determines that such 136 private entities provide services essential to the welfare of the 137 community.

SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall provide enhanced training to local governments, supervisors, mayors, civil defense groups and municipal associations in disaster management.

SECTION 11. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

176 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 177 Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency 178 shall have authority to transfer not more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any general or special fund 179 180 treasury fund and major object budget category to another special 181 or general fund treasury fund and major object budget category 182 accordingly under the control of the Mississippi Emergency 183 Management Agency. The purpose of this authority is to more 184 efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the 185 186 Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit written 187 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office 188 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the 189 fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the 190 transfer.

191 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the192 Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit a

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196 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that from 197 any funds appropriated in this act, the agency shall maintain a 198 minimum of nine (9) Area Coordinators to provide daily assistance 199 to local jurisdictions with emergency management activities as well as to provide quicker response to incidents and/or disasters. 200 201 In addition, it is the intent of the Legislature that these Area 202 Coordinators shall reside in or within fifty (50) miles of their 203 assigned districts.

204 SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that 205 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 206 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 207 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 208 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 209 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 210 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 211 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 16. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of Capital Expense Funds for the purpose of defraying the expenses for vehicle purchases, as authorized in Senate Bill

218 No. 2917, 2021 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 219 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023\$ 75,500.00.

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 2022.

SECTION 17. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency is hereby authorized to pay invoices submitted by eTech Channel for reimbursement for prior fiscal year commodities in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$115,000.00).

228 SECTION 18. The expenditure of the funds appropriated by 229 this act shall be under the direction of the Governor and shall be 230 paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the proper fund or 231 funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State 232 Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his 233 warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or 234 officers in the manner provided by law.

235 **SECTION 19.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 236 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after 237 June 30, 2022.
