1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE 2 MISSISSIPPI WORKERS' COMPENSATION COMMISSION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 4 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred by the Mississippi Workers' 7 8 Compensation Commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.....\$ 5,648,867.00. 9

10 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Workers' Compensation Commission 12 13 for the purpose of defraying the expenses for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023...\$ 75,000.00 14 SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 15 16 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 17 Treasury to the credit of the Second Injury Fund (Fund Number 3352300000) for the purpose of making payments under the 18

With the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 23 act, the following positions are authorized: 24 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

25 Permanent: 55

26 Time-Limited: 0

27 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 28 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 29 Services for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 funds 30 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 31 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the Mississippi 32 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 33 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the 34 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board 35 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the 36 37 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for 38 Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the 39 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 40 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions 41 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception 42 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

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43 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 44 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 45 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 46 47 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 48 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 49 50 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 51 appropriated level.

52 No General Funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 53 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 54 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 55 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

66 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that with 67 the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, the Mississippi

112	SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that
113	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
114	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
115	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
116	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
117	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to

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118 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 119 made without competitive bids.

120 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 121 salary of the Workers' Compensation Commission members shall be 122 equal and the salary of the commission chairman shall exceed these 123 salaries as approved by the State Personnel Board.

124 SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 125 Section 2 of this act, Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00), 126 or so much thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State 127 Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in 128 Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a 129 manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. This 130 appropriation is made for the purpose of upgrades to the 131 commission's imaging system and other equipment.

SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

139 **SECTION 11.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 140 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 141 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 142 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
