2	THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI GAMING COMMISSION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Gaming Commission for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending
10	June 30, 2023 \$ 7,580,212.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Gaming
14	Commission, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
15	commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending
16	June 30, 2023 \$ 1,652,921.00.
17	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
18	this act, the following positions are authorized:

24	With the funds	herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
25	responsibility to ma	ake certain that funds required for "Personal
26	Services" for Fisca	l Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023
27	funds appropriated	for that purpose unless programs or positions
28	are added to the age	ency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the
29	Mississippi Legisla	ture. The Legislature shall determine the
30	agency's personal se	ervices appropriation, which shall be published
31	by the State Person	nel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel
32	Board shall determine	ne and publish the projected annualized payroll
33	costs based on curre	ent employees. It shall be the responsibility
34	of the agency head	to ensure that actual personnel expenditures
35	for Fiscal Year 202	3 do not exceed the data provided by the
36	Legislative Budget	Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023
37	projected cost excee	eds the annualized costs, no salary actions
38	shall be processed b	by the State Personnel Board with the exception

40	Any transfers	or escalations shall be made in accordance with
41	the terms, condition	ns and procedures established by law or
42	allowable under the	terms set forth within this act. The State
43	Personnel Board sha	ll not escalate positions without written

- 44 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 45 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 46 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 47 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 48 appropriated level.
- 49 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 50 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 51 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 52 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 54 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 55 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 56 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 57 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 58 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
- 59 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- 60 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
- 61 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
- 62 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
- 63 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, a portion
- 64 shall be derived from the amount of forfeited property that is
- 65 seized by the Gaming Commission, which shall be deposited into a
- 66 special fund created by the Department of Finance and
- 67 Administration and may be expended by the commission for the

- 68 specific purpose of increasing law enforcement resources as 69 outlined in Section 41-29-185, Mississippi Code 1972.
- 70 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, a portion
- 71 shall be derived from the amount that is received by the Gaming
- 72 Commission under the Gaming Control Act, which shall be deposited
- 73 into a special fund created by the Department of Finance and
- 74 Administration and may be expended by the commission for the
- 75 purpose of investigating, permitting, interagency fees, and
- 76 providing fingerprint analysis by the Department of Public Safety.
- 77 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 78 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 79 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 80 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 81
- 82 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 83 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 84 made without competitive bids.
- SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 85
- 86 Gaming Commission shall maintain complete accounting and personnel
- 87 records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under
- 88 this act and that such records shall be in the same format and
- level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2022. It is further 89
- 90 the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request
- for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative 91
- Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the 92

93	format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2023
94	budget request process.
95	SECTION 8. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
96	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
97	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
98	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
99	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
100	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
101	performance measures provided below:

118	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
119	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
120	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
121	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
122	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
123	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
124	actions contrary to this provision.
125	SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
126	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
127	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
128	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
129	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
130	proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
131	SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from
132	and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after
133	June 30, 2022.
