The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of paying salaries and defraying the expenses of the State Department of 8 9 Audit in making the audits and investigations of public offices of the state and counties as provided by Section 7-7-201 et seq., 10 11 Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.....\$ 8,848,242.00. 12 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 13 14 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any special funds in the 15 State Treasury to the credit of the State Department of Audit's 16 special fund account for the purpose of paying salaries and defraying the expenses of the State Department of Audit in making 17 18 the audits and investigations of public offices of the state and

19 counties as provided by Section 7-7-201 et seq., Mississippi Code 20 of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending 21 June 30, 2023.....\$ 4,428,761.00. 22 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 23 this act, the following positions are authorized: 24 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT: 164 25 Permanent: 26 Time-Limited: 27 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 28 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 29 Services for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 funds 30 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 31 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the Mississippi 32 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 33 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the 34 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board 35 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the 36 37 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for 38 Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the 39 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 40 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions 41 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception

of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

- 131 SECTION 8. No more than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) 132 may be provided to defray expenses incurred by the Office of the 133 State Auditor pursuant to the rules and regulations of the United States Department of Justice Federal Equitable Sharing Program. 134 135 These funds may only be used for nonbudgeted law enforcement 136 purposes by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 137 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 138 State Department of Audit shall maintain complete accounting and 139 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 140 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 141

- 152 **SECTION 11.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- of Section 2 of this act, One Hundred Thousand Dollars
- (\$100,000.00), or so much thereof, shall be derived out of any
- 155 money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense
- 156 Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972,
- 157 and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office.
- 158 These funds are provided for IT equipment expenditures.
- 159 **SECTION 12.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 160 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 161 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 162 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 163 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 164 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
- 165 **SECTION 13.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 166 and after July 1, 2022.
