1 2	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
4	SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
5	may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
6	State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the
7	expenses of the Mississippi Development Authority for the fiscal
8	year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
9	\$ 20,438,373.00.
LO	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L1	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
L2	Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Development Authority or
L3	the appropriate special fund for the purpose of defraying the
L4	expenses incurred in the operation of the various divisions of the
L5	authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending
L6	June 30, 2023 \$ 82,963,650.00.
L7	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
L8	this act, the following positions are authorized:

- 57 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 58 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
- 59 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- 60 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
- 61 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
- 62 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
- 63 **SECTION 4.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 64 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 65 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 66 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 67 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

115	SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section	on 2, the				
116	amount of Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$800,000.00) shall be					
117	provided from the Mississippi Department of Transportation to					

118 defray the expenses of the Mississippi Development Authority in 119 operating the state welcome centers.

120 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 121 Mississippi Development Authority shall maintain complete 122 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 123 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 124 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 125 Year 2022. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 126 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be 127 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 128 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 129 provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process.

SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, the amount of Four Million Eight Hundred Seventy-six Thousand Two Hundred Ninety-eight Dollars (\$4,876,298.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is provided for the purpose of supporting Mississippi Tourism Advertising and Promotion for Fiscal Year 2023, and shall not be expended for any type of cultural exchange program. Of the funds appropriated herein and allocated within this section, Two Hundred Ninety-nine Thousand Dollars (\$299,000.00) is provided for Tourism Grant Development Awards.

SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony

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- 143 announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public
- 144 announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening
- of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has
- 146 made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or
- 147 any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following
- 148 language: "Funds were made available for this project by the
- 149 Mississippi State Legislature."
- 150 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 151 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 152 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 153 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 154 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 155 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 156 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 157 made without competitive bids.
- 158 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, One
- 159 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is provided for the
- 160 Mississippi Delta National Heritage Areas.
- SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, One
- 162 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is provided for the
- 163 Mississippi Hills National Heritage Area.
- 164 **SECTION 12.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 165 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital
- 166 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the Mississippi
- 167 Development Authority for the purpose of reauthorizing the

168	expenditure of Capital Expense Funds for the MDA Site Development
169	Grant Program Fund, as authorized in Senate Bill No. 2951, 2021
170	Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and
171	ending June 30, 2023 \$ 10,000,000.00
172	Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the
173	provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
174	exceed the unexpended balance of June 30, 2022.
175	SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
176	Mississippi Development Authority is hereby authorized to
177	escalate, budget, and expend funds from any source not to exceed
178	Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) in accordance with rules and
179	regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a
180	manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.
181	SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
182	Mississippi Development Authority shall submit a notification of
183	any General Fund Transfers out of the major category Subsidies
184	into any other major categories to the Legislative Budget Office.
185	SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Twenty
186	Thousand Twenty-five Dollars (\$20,025.00) shall be provided for
187	the support of the Mississippi River Parkway Commission.
188	SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Zero
189	Dollars (\$0.00) shall be transferred to Innovate Mississippi.
190	SECTION 17. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, One

Hundred Fifty-six Thousand Dollars (\$156,000.00) is provided for

- 194 **SECTION 18.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 195 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital
- 196 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the Mississippi
- 197 Development Authority for the purpose of reauthorizing the
- 198 expenditure of Capital Expense Funds for the Air Service
- 199 Development Act, as authorized in Senate Bill No. 2977, 2020
- 200 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and
- 201 ending June 30, 2023\$ 246,431.00.
- Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the
- 203 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
- 204 exceed the unexpended balance of June 30, 2022.
- 205 **SECTION 19.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 206 Mississippi Development Authority may provide operational support
- 207 to any park operated by the United States National Park Service in
- 208 Mississippi during the event of a government shutdown that
- 209 materially affects the operations of such park.
- 210 **SECTION 20.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 211 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 212 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 213 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 214 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 215 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 21. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after June 30, 2022.
