3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
6	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
7	maintenance of the Secretary of State for the fiscal year
8	beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
9	\$ 11,794,282.00.
10	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
11	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
12	source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available
13	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Secretary of
14	State for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending
15	June 30, 2023\$ 15,673,069.00.
16	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
17	Section 1, the following positions are authorized:

- 56 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 57 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
- 58 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- 59 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
- 60 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
- 61 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
- 62 **SECTION 4.** None of the funds appropriated by this act shall
- 63 be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or
- 64 necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the Office
- 65 of the Secretary of State that are authorized by the Mississippi
- 66 Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or
- 67 regulations that implement state or federal law.

68 SECTION 5. No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be 69 used, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of paying any 70 clerk, stenographer, assistant, deputy, or other person who may be 71 related by blood or marriage within the third degree, computed by 72 the rules of the civil law, to the official employing or having 73 the right of employment or selection thereof; and in the event of 74 any such payment, then the official or person approving and making 75 or receiving such payment shall be jointly and severally liable to 76 return to the State of Mississippi and to pay into the State 77 Treasury three (3) times any such amount so paid or received, to 78 be recovered at suit of the Attorney General; provided that when 79 the relationship is by affinity and the person through whom the 80 relationship was established is dead, this provision shall not 81 apply.

SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, the Secretary of State may use funds appropriated for the purposes of defraying litigation expenses associated with the enforcement of the Mississippi Securities Act, the Regulation of Charitable Solicitations Act, and the administration of the Public Trust.

SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

- 120 than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is provided for
- 121 paying principal and interest on bond issues for county voting
- 122 systems.
- 123 **SECTION 9.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One
- 124 Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$1,750,000.00), or
- 125 so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any
- 126 money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Land Records
- 127 Maintenance Fund, for the purpose of making distributions to local
- 128 governments for taxes owed during the fiscal year.
- 129 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One
- 130 Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00), or so much
- 131 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in
- 132 the State Treasury to the credit of the Elections Support Fund,
- 133 for the purpose of acquiring, upgrading, maintaining, or repairing
- 134 voting equipment, systems, and supplies, hiring temporary
- 135 technical support, conducting elections using such voting
- 136 equipment or systems and training election officials during the
- 137 fiscal year.
- 138 **SECTION 11.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Eleven
- 139 Million Four Hundred Fifty-five Thousand Two Hundred Forty-seven
- 140 Dollars (\$11,455,247.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary,
- 141 is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the

143	transferred by the Secretary of State to the Mississippi
144	Department of Marine Resources.
145	SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that
146	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
147	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
148	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
149	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
150	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
151	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
152	made without competitive bids.
153	SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
154	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
155	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
156	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
157	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
158	proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
159	SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from
160	and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after
161	June 30, 2022.
