11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

In addition to all other sums herein 68 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 69 necessary, is appropriated out of Coronavirus State Local Recovery 70 Fund to the credit of the Department of Finance and Administration 71 and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office 72 to defray the expenses of the Department of Finance and

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Administration for the period beginning July 1, 2021, and ending 73 June 30, 2022\$ 8,046,958.00. 74 75 This additional appropriation is for the purpose of providing 76 Coronavirus State Local Recovery Funds to nonentitlement units of 77 local government in accordance with the provisions applicable to 78 the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund in Section 9901 of the 79 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Public Law No. 117-2) and any 80 applicable federal guidelines.

91 SECTION 5. SECTION 6. In addition to all other sums herein appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Capital Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Department of Health for the purpose of providing reimbursable grants as described in this section, for the period beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022..... \$ 9,852,684.00.

107 The funds appropriated under this section shall be expended 108 by the State Department of Health as a reimbursable grant to 109 entities up to the difference between the 2021 and 2022 Victims of 110 Crime Act (VOCA) grants awarded by the Department. In determining 111 reimbursable expenses, the State Department of Health shall use 112 allowable costs for VOCA funds as defined by the Office for 113 Victims of Crime.

114 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 115 entities receiving funding under Section 6 of this act for 116 allowable expenses under Medicaid, Federal Child Welfare Funds, 117 and other federal programs establish the process of billing 118 expenses under these programs due to the uncertain sustainability 119 of VOCA funds.

SECTION 8. In addition to all other sums herein appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money to the credit of the

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123 Institutions of Higher Learning - Office of Student Financial Aid 124 and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office 125 to defray the expenses of the Institutions of Higher Learning -126 Office of Student Financial Aid for the period beginning July 1, 127 2021, and ending June 30, 2022..... \$ 3,500,000.00. 128 This additional appropriation is made for the purpose of 129 administering a summer grant program using funds awarded through the second Governor's Emergency Educational Relief Fund. 130 131 **SECTION 9.** In addition to all other sums herein appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 132 133 necessary, is appropriated out of any money to the credit of the Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid and allocated in a manner 134 135 as determined by the Treasurer's Office to defray the expenses of 136 the Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid for the period

beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022......\$ 466,786,240.00.
This additional appropriation is for the purpose of providing additional federal matching funds for mandated Medicaid medical services.

142 SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from 143 and after passage.

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
