## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 509

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING MISSISSIPPI STATE PAROLE BOARD CHAIRMAN STEVEN PICKETT AS THE LONGEST-SERVING CHAIRMAN ON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT AFTER 30 YEARS OF EFFECTIVE GOVERNMENT SERVICE.

- 5 WHEREAS, Mississippi State Parole Board Chairman Steven
- 6 Pickett retired from a 30-year career in public service, effective
- 7 December 31, 2021; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Steven Pickett ably served for nine years on the
- 9 five-member Parole Board beginning November 10, 2012, after
- 10 Governor Phil Bryant appointed him. He was named chairman one
- 11 year later. Having been reappointed by Governor Tate Reeves in
- 12 2020, he is the longest-serving chairman; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Steven Pickett thanked Governor Reeves in his
- 14 retirement letter and explained, "My thirty years of public
- 15 service in law enforcement, with the courts and on the Parole
- 16 Board have provided me the opportunity to make a difference in
- 17 many people's lives. Helping people was my primary goal when I
- 18 began my career in law enforcement, as it is for all the men and
- 19 women who protect and serve us. My position on the Parole Board

- 20 provided me a different kind of opportunity to help others, by
- 21 giving a second chance to those who earned it and denying it to
- 22 those who remain a threat to public safety"; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Steven Pickett came to the board after serving as a
- 24 longtime deputy to Hinds County Sheriff Malcolm McMillin, who was
- 25 on the board when Steven Pickett joined. His career also included
- 26 serving as a Hinds County Youth Court Resource Officer, Hinds
- 27 County Deputy Chancery Clerk and Justice Court Judge in Hinds
- 28 County; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Steven Pickett estimated that he handled more than
- 30 sixty thousand parole and revocation decisions. "The prison
- 31 population is the lowest it has been in 22 years, at just under
- 32 17,000. The decrease in population is due, in large part, to the
- 33 difficult and important decisions made by the board"; and
- 34 WHEREAS, Steven Pickett was responsible for organizing and
- 35 directing the annual Law Enforcement Awards Recognition Ceremony
- 36 at the Mississippi Trade Mart, the state's largest annual Law
- 37 Enforcement Memorial Ceremony which honors the state's fallen
- 38 officers from the previous year and Central Mississippi TOP COPS;
- 39 and
- 40 WHEREAS, although he will be leaving government service, he
- 41 will continue helping others by working with the Mississippi
- 42 Center for Police & Sheriffs' Warrior Cottages Program in
- 43 Vicksburg, which provides housing to those in need, including
- 44 veterans; and
