## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 527

- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE
  UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI "OLE MISS REBELS" WOMEN'S GOLF TEAM AND
  COACH KORY HENKES FOR WINNING THEIR FIRST WOMEN'S NATIONAL TITLE
  IN SCHOOL HISTORY.
- 5 WHEREAS, it was a fairytale ending for Ole Miss Women's Golf
- 6 at Grayhawk Golf Club in Scottsdale, Arizona, defeating Oklahoma
- 7 State 4-1 on May 26, 2021, to capture the 2021 NCAA National
- 8 Championship; and
- 9 WHEREAS, with the title, Ole Miss claimed its first National
- 10 Championship since the school's 1962 football title. The Rebels
- 11 also became the first Ole Miss women's team to claim an NCAA
- 12 National Championship; and
- 13 WHEREAS, in the final match of the season, with a National
- 14 Championship on the line, Sophomore Chiara Tamburlini was eager to
- 15 win her team a point for the first time and did just that out of
- 16 the third position. The Switzerland native came out strong,

- 17 birdieing three of her first seven holes, but more importantly,
- 18 building a commanding six-hole lead through nine. She conceded
- 19 her first hole of the day on number 10 but took a par-4 on number

- 20 12 to put the pressure on OSU. Not wasting any time, Tamburlini
- 21 won 6&5 to put the first point on the board; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Kennedy Swann teed off in her customary leadoff
- 23 spot, extended her career match play record to 10-2. Tied through
- 24 the first six holes in match play, the senior began to separate
- 25 herself. She sank an eagle on number 7 to go up and was not able
- 26 to be caught. Swann continued with a deep birdie and par putt to
- 27 go 3-up heading into the back nine. Oklahoma State managed to cut
- 28 the deficit to one but the Austin, Texas, product responded, going
- 29 stroke-for-stroke before sinking the final birdie on number 17 to
- 30 snag the second point and inch Ole Miss that much closer to the
- 31 title; and
- 32 WHEREAS, "It took a lot of players to buy in," said Head
- 33 Coach Kory Henkes. "Our team is very disciplined, and I think
- 34 that's what I pride us on the most. When we come out to practice,
- 35 we have a purpose every single day, and we hold each other
- 36 accountable which is the really cool part about it. We don't
- 37 necessarily have to push them as much as they are going to push
- 38 each other. I think that's the important part of team chemistry,
- 39 having everyone buy into the same thing"; and
- 40 WHEREAS, during the postseason, the Ole Miss Women's Golf
- 41 Team received many awards following its first national title in
- 42 program history. Head Coach Kory Henkes was named the 2020-2021
- 43 Division I Jackie Steinmann Women's Golf Coaches Association
- 44 "National Coach of the Year," presented by Golf Pride. Coach

- 45 Henkes became the first Rebel Head Coach to earn the award from
- 46 the Women's Golf Coaches Association (WGCA). Ole Miss finished in
- 47 fourth place or better in nine of the team's 10 tournaments during
- 48 the 2020-2021 season, including First Place at the East Lake Cup
- 49 and Gators Invitational. The Top 5 Ole Miss single-round averages
- 50 throughout a season have all come during Coach Henkes' tenure,
- 51 including the 2020-2021 mark of 289.4, which ranks second in
- 52 program history. The nine Top 5 team finishes during the
- 53 2020-2021 season are also a new school record. Julia Johnson and
- 54 Kennedy Swann earned WGCA All-America honors, with Johnson
- 55 becoming the program's first-ever First-Team All-American; and
- 56 WHEREAS, under Coach Henkes' quidance, Julia Johnson finished
- 57 the season ranked number 8 individually in the NCAA by both
- 58 Golfstat and Golfweek and led the team in stroke average (71.34).
- 59 Johnson tallied five Top 5, eight Top 10 and nine Top 20 finishes
- 60 this season, including a fifth place individual finish at the NCAA
- 61 Championship; and
- 62 WHEREAS, the Ole Miss Woman's Golf Team earned its first-ever
- 63 WGCA All-Scholar Team GPA Award ranking 10th in the nation among
- 64 more than 300 NCAA Division I schools with a cumulative team grade
- 65 point average of 3.88 for the 2020-2021 academic year. WGCA
- 66 All-Scholar GPA Award Top 25 team in the same season. Four Rebels
- 67 were honored with the WGCA All-America Scholars: Ellen Hume
- 68 Andrea Lignell, Kennedy Swann and Chiara Tamburlini all earned the
- 69 prestigious accolade; and

- 70 WHEREAS, the members of the 2021 National Championship Ole
- 71 Miss Women's Golf Team were: Kennedy Swann, Chiara Tamburlini,
- 72 Julia Johnson, McKinley Cunningham, Natacha Host Husted, Ellen
- 73 Hume, Ellen Hutchinson-Kay, Andrea Lignell and Smilla Sonderby;
- 74 and Head Coach Korey Henkes and Associate Head Coach Zack Byrd;

- 76 WHEREAS, we join the students, faculty and sponsors in
- 77 recognizing this special group of university athletes who have
- 78 brought honor to their university, their community and to the
- 79 State of Mississippi:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 81 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 82 we do hereby commend and congratulate the University of
- 83 Mississippi "Ole Miss Rebels" Women's Golf Team and Coach Kory
- 84 Henkes for winning their first women's National Title in school
- 85 history, and extend to the team, coaches, parents and sponsors our
- 86 best wishes for continued success.
- 87 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 88 Coach Kory Henkes and Ole Miss Chancellor Glenn Boyce for the
- 89 team, forwarded to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of
- 90 Higher Learning, and made available to the Capitol Press Corps.
