## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 530

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF BRIDGETTE  
2 ROCHELLE HORN OF PHILADELPHIA, MISSISSIPPI, AND COMMENDING HER  
3 MILITARY AND LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICE TO HER NATION AND HER  
4 COMMUNITY.

5 WHEREAS, we join the citizens of Philadelphia, Carthage and  
6 Meridian, Mississippi, in mourning the passing of Bridgette  
7 Rochelle Horn on November 19, 2020. Bridgette was born on May 26,  
8 1983, to Pam Daniels and Bobby K. Horn; and

9 WHEREAS, Bridgette graduated Basic Training from Lackland Air  
10 Force Base, San Antonio, Texas, on April 26, 2002, where she  
11 received the Marksmanship Award. Some of her military deployments  
12 included: Iraq, Columbia, Israel and Estonia; and

13 WHEREAS, some of Bridgette's awards and decorations were:  
14 two Air Force Achievement Medals, Air Force Outstanding Unit  
15 Award, Air Force Reserve Meritorious Service Medal, National  
16 Defense Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Global War  
17 on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service  
18 Medal, Armed Services Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal, Air Force  
19 Expedition Service Medal, Air Force Longevity Medal, Air Force



20 Reserve Medal, Small Arms Expert Marksman Ribbon, Air Force  
21 Training Ribbon, Mississippi Medal of Efficiency, Mississippi War  
22 Medal, Mississippi Emergency Medal, and Mississippi Longevity  
23 Medal. Bridgette was an avid marksman, receiving many  
24 marksmanship awards and mentoring others; and

25 WHEREAS, Bridgette was promoted on December 7, 2014, as the  
26 first female Master Sergeant in the 186th Security Forces Squadron  
27 at Keyfield Air National Guard Base, where she served on active  
28 duty status for 19 years; and

29 WHEREAS, Bridgette was a Police Officer with the Meridian  
30 Police Department from March 15, 2017, until her death on November  
31 19, 2020. Bridgette was promoted to Detective on March 25, 2020;

33 WHEREAS, Bridgette was a member of Salem Baptist Church in  
34 Carthage, Mississippi. She was attending Longino Baptist Church  
35 in Philadelphia at the time of her death. Bridgette is mourned by  
36 her mother, Pam Younger, and her stepfather, John Younger; father,  
37 Bobby Horn, and stepmother, Susan Horn; and her Godson, Eli  
38 Pendleton; along with numerous beloved relatives. Bridgette was  
39 dedicated to God, her jobs and had a heart full of love for  
40 children; and

41 WHEREAS, Bridgette's legacy is her devotion to a strong and  
42 free America, and for this and for a lifetime of selfless service,
