SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 537

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE RECOGNITION OF THE

2 MISSISSIPPI LEGISLATURE TO FOUNDING DIRECTOR OF THE MISSISSIPPI 3 BOOK FESTIVAL HOLLY LANGE AS THE RECIPIENT OF THE 2022 GOVERNOR'S ARTS AWARD GOVERNOR'S CHOICE. 5 WHEREAS, the Governor's Arts Awards Program has announced its 2022 recipients, which includes the Founding Director of the 6 7 Mississippi Book Festival Holly Lange as the 2022 Governor's Arts Award Governor's Choice; and 8 WHEREAS, established in 1988, Governor's Arts Awards are 9 10 given to individuals and organizations to recognize outstanding work in the artistic disciplines, as well as arts-based community 11 12 development and arts patronage in Mississippi. The awards are presented in partnership with the Governor's Office and signify 13 14 the important relationship between government and the arts; and 15 WHEREAS, born and raised in Austin, Texas, Holly Powell Lange 16 has already made a lasting imprint on her adopted State of 17 Mississippi, particularly in the realm of the arts. Her acumen at

steady stream of high-profile projects; and

         WHEREAS, in the early part of the 21st Century, Lange ran two

    popular annual creative events in Jackson: the Jubilee! JAM Music

    and Arts Festival and the emerging Crossroads Film Festival.

- 50 Lange Management. Holly and her husband, Alan, have two sons,
