SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 554

- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING
 MILLICENT GUNTER OF BAYOU VIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN GULFPORT FOR
 RECEIVING MISSISSIPPI'S 2020 PRESIDENTIAL AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN
 MATHEMATICS AND SCIENCE TEACHING, WHICH IS THE HIGHEST SUCH AWARD
- 5 FROM THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT.
- 6 WHEREAS, Millicent Gunter is one of two Mississippi teachers
- 7 who earned national recognition as recipients of the 2020
- 8 Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and Science
- 9 Teaching (PAEMST). Millicent is a Math Teacher at Bayou View
- 10 Elementary in the Gulfport School District; and
- 11 WHEREAS, established in 1983, PAEMST is the highest award
- 12 kindergarten through 12th-grade mathematics and science, including
- 13 computer science, teachers can receive from the U.S. government.
- 14 Each year, the award criteria alternates years between
- 15 kindergarten through sixth-grade and seventh through 12th-grade
- 16 teachers. This year, kindergarten through sixth-grade teachers
- 17 received the awards. Award recipients over the years represent
- 18 schools and organizations from all 50 states, Washington, D.C.,

- 19 Puerto Rico, Department of Defense Education Activity schools, and
- 20 the U.S. territories; and
- 21 WHEREAS, nominees complete a rigorous application process
- 22 that allows them to demonstrate deep content knowledge and their
- 23 ability to adapt to a broad range of learners and teaching
- 24 environments. A panel of distinguished mathematicians, scientists
- 25 and educators at the state and national levels assesses the
- 26 applications before recommending nominees to the White House
- 27 Office of Science and Technology Policy. Teachers are selected
- 28 based on their distinction in the classroom and dedication to
- 29 improving STEM education; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Millicent Gunter has been an educator for more than
- 31 30 years and has spent the last 18 years teaching in the Gulfport
- 32 School District. She is currently teaching all subjects in third
- 33 grade at Bayou View Elementary School. She previously taught at
- 34 Westminster Academy for 10 years and Diamondhead Academy for the
- 35 first two years of her teaching career; and
- 36 WHEREAS, in her classroom, Millicent challenges students to
- 37 explore problem-based mathematics, motivates students to become
- 38 problem solvers, incorporates real-world scenarios, and implements
- 39 mathematical discourse to promote deeper student thinking. Her
- 40 classroom is an active learning environment where technology is
- 41 incorporated into her daily lessons; and
- WHEREAS, in addition to teaching third grade, Millicent also
- 43 serves as the K-5 Mathematics Coach. As a lead teacher, she

- 44 facilitates professional development for teachers, continues to
- 45 build a site-level collaborative mathematics team, mentors student
- 46 teachers, monitors site-level mathematics programs, plans
- 47 activities to celebrate student success, and orchestrates family
- 48 Math Night. Millicent has served on several district and state
- 49 committees. She has attended numerous national conferences,
- 50 including NCTM, Model Schools, the Ron Clark Academy, and Staff
- 51 Development for Educators. She has been able to implement
- 52 programs and enhance curriculum from the knowledge gained from the
- 53 conferences; and
- 54 WHEREAS, Millicent stated, "Being named a finalist for the
- 55 Presidential Award has been a truly humbling experience. I am
- 56 extremely grateful for teachers and colleagues who have mentored
- 57 and encouraged me throughout my journey of teaching. This award
- 58 recognizes my commitment to providing the best mathematics
- 59 instruction I can for my students, and it is rewarding to know
- 60 that I have had an impact on their success. This award inspires
- 61 me to continue to search for best practices in education and
- 62 implement them with intention":

- 70 Gulfport School District our best wishes for continued excellence
