1 2	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE SCHOOL OF LAW DEAN PATRICIA BENNETT ON THE OCCASION OF HER RETIREMENT.
3	WHEREAS, the Honorable Patricia Bennett, well-known and
4	highly respected Dean of Mississippi College School of Law, has
5	announced her intention to retire from her position as Dean in
6	June of 2022, after three decades of superior leadership and
7	exceptional service to the acclaimed educational institution and
8	the legal profession; and
9	WHEREAS, raised in Scott County by a respected family in
10	Forest, Mississippi, she learned from her parents at an early age
11	the invaluable lesson that hard work and education are the keys to
12	success; and
13	WHEREAS, after demonstrating her scholarly talents during
14	high school, Dean Bennett attended and graduated from Tougaloo
15	College, where she excelled in her academic subjects and was

- 22 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett took and passed the Mississippi Bar
- 23 Examination and was admitted to practice law in the State and
- 24 Federal Courts of Mississippi; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett served as Assistant District Attorney
- 26 for Hinds and Yazoo Counties, where she began her criminal law
- 27 practice and demonstrated her courtroom skills; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett served as a Special Assistant Attorney
- 29 General with the Mississippi Attorney General's Office in Jackson,
- 30 providing superior representation on behalf of the State of
- 31 Mississippi; and
- 32 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett served her country in the military as a
- 33 Judge Advocate Officer in the United States Army Reserve and in
- 34 the Mississippi National Guard when she answered the call to duty
- 35 and provided selfless and honorable service; and
- 36 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett served in the Department of Justice as
- 37 an Assistant United States Attorney, where she prosecuted a series
- 38 of high-profile and challenging cases ranging from murders to
- 39 white-collar crimes, securing convictions which ensured the fair
- 40 administration of justice and the safety of the citizenry; and
- WHEREAS, Dean Bennett joined the faculty of Mississippi
- 42 College School of Law in 1989 and expertly taught a generation of
- 43 law students Trial Practice, Mediation, Advocacy, Criminal

- 44 Procedure, Client Interviewing and Counseling, Litigation
- 45 Technology, and Criminal Law, and also taught as a visiting
- 46 Professor at Harvard Law School, Emory Law School and the
- 47 University of Arkansas at Little Rock Law School; and
- WHEREAS, Dean Bennett was selected as Mississippi College's
- 49 Professor of the Year, the highest teaching award given by the
- 50 University and delivered the convocation address for Mississippi
- 51 College; and
- 52 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett served as the Director of the
- 53 Litigation and Dispute Resolution Center at Mississippi College
- 54 School of Law, where she organized courses designed to promote
- 55 effective litigation skills and brought speakers to the law school
- 56 to provide a rich commentary for the law students such as U.S.
- 57 Supreme Court Chief Justice John Roberts and thus elevated the
- 58 standing of the Mississippi College School of Law in the legal
- 59 community; and
- 60 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett chaired every important Faculty
- 61 Committee and supported numerous speaker programs, student
- 62 activities, and alumni events; and
- 63 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett agreed to serve as Interim Dean of
- 64 Mississippi College School of Law in December of 2016, following
- 65 the departure of her predecessor, and later in December 2017 was
- 66 unanimously voted by the law faculty to take the title of Dean and
- 67 Henry Vaughan Watkins and Selby Watkins McRae Professor of Law,

- 68 approved by the Board of Trustees of Mississippi College for this
- 69 leadership role; and
- 70 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett served as President of the Charles
- 71 Clark Chapter of the American Inns of Court, actively participated
- 72 in the activities of the Inn as a Bencher, and encouraged student
- 73 participation in the Inn, exposing law students to expert
- 74 practitioners and judges; and
- 75 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett has been the recipient of numerous
- 76 professional awards to include the 2002 Susie Blue Buchanan Award,
- 77 the 2018 Lifetime Achievement Award from the Mississippi Women
- 78 Lawyers Association, the Professionalism Award from the Capital
- 79 Area Bar Association, the Professionalism Award from the
- 80 Mississippi Bar Foundation, Mississippi College School of Law
- 81 Faculty Collegiality Award, Mississippi College School of Law
- 82 Alumni Association Lawyer of the Year Award, Hinds County Bar
- 83 Association Outstanding Service Award and the Professionalism in
- 84 the Field of Law Award; and
- WHEREAS, Dean Bennett served the legal community through her
- 86 position as a member of the Board of Commissioners of The
- 87 Mississippi Bar, Trustee of the Mississippi Bar Foundation, Bar
- 88 President's Forum Committee, Mississippi Supreme Court Rules
- 89 Advisory Committee, U.S. District Court Advisory Group for the
- 90 Civil Justice Reform Act, the Supreme Court Task Force on Gender
- 91 Fairness, numerous Mississippi Bar committees, President of the
- 92 Hinds County Bar Association, President and Governor Emeritus of

- 95 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett was elected by the attorneys of
- 96 Mississippi to serve as President of The Mississippi Bar for the
- 97 term from July 2017 to July 2018, after taking the oath of office
- 98 from Chief Justice William Waller, Jr., of the Mississippi Supreme
- 99 Court, where she represented The Mississippi Bar throughout the
- 100 State of Mississippi and in regional and national gatherings of
- 101 Bar Presidents; and
- 102 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett championed efforts to promote diversity
- 103 and inclusion not only at Mississippi College School of Law but
- 104 also in legal education writ large and in society; and
- 105 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett led the Mississippi College School of
- 106 Law through a successful accreditation review by the Council on
- 107 Legal Education and Admission to the Bar of the American Bar
- 108 Association after having improved the credentials of entering law
- 109 students and increased the bar examination passage rate; and
- 110 WHEREAS, Dean Bennett was a member of and active in a series
- 111 of professional associations designed to promote the rule of law
- 112 and the fair administration of justice to include being a Fellow
- 113 of the American Bar Association and the Mississippi Bar
- 114 Foundation, as well as maintaining membership in the American Bar
- 115 Association, the Mississippi Bar Association, the Magnolia Bar
- 116 Association, the Fifth Circuit Bar Association, and the
- 117 Mississippi Women Lawyers Association; and

118	WHEREAS, Dean Bennett led the Mississippi College School of
119	Law through the COVID-19 challenges, ensuring that faculty, staff,
120	and students remained healthy while functioning in an in-person
121	learning environment; and
122	WHEREAS, Dean Patricia Bennett's husband Claude, a building
123	contractor, has given generously of his time and energy to assist
124	Dean Bennett with her decanal duties and in particular with her
125	leadership role while President of The Mississippi Bar; and
126	WHEREAS, as Patricia Bennett prepares to retire from her
127	position as Dean of the Mississippi College School of Law, it is
128	most appropriate that this Legislature respectfully acknowledges
129	her immeasurable contributions to the Mississippi College School
130	of Law and the entire legal profession which, by positively
131	influencing the education and training of tomorrow's bench and bar
132	while working to create increased access to necessary legal
133	services for all, have greatly benefited not only the individual
