SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 568

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE LEGACY OF DR. JAMES 2 OLIVER, M.D., AS THE FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN TO GRADUATE FROM THE 3 UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI SCHOOL OF MEDICINE.

4 WHEREAS, James Oliver, a native son of Mississippi was the first African American to graduate from the University of 5 Mississippi School of Medicine; and 6 7 WHEREAS, a highly respected Physician, Assistant Professor of Internal Medicine and Cardiologist in the Maryland, Virginia and 8 9 District of Columbia area, Dr. Oliver is Board Certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine. After practicing medicine 10 11 for 40 years, he is currently retired and living in Chesapeake Beach, Maryland; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Dr. Oliver's career included the following 14 impressive assignments: United States Army, Honorable discharge, 15 1965-1968; Internship, Harvard University Medical Service Boston 16 City Hospital, 1972-1973; Resident/Fellowship, Boston University Medical/Cardiology Service Boston City Hospital, 1973-1976; 17
