6	never won a State Championship in fast-pitch softball, or even
7	played in a Championship Series. That just made the May 13, 2021,
8	6-1 win over Raleigh High School to clinch the 2021 Mississippi
9	High School Activities Association (MHSAA) 3A Championship all the
10	sweeter; and
11	WHEREAS, "These kids have worked so hard since last year when
12	they got their season cut short. From day one, they've been
13	grinding every single day. This was our ultimate goal and to come
14	here and win is indescribable. It makes everything we've done and
15	all the work we've put in worth it," said Booneville Coach Jessica

WHEREAS, the Lady Blue Devils (30-4) jumped all over the

- 21 third pitch she saw and launched it over the left-center wall.
- 22 Garrett's blast gave Booneville a lead it never relinquished, but
- 23 she and Burns weren't finished. They added back-to-back RBI
- 24 doubles in the sixth inning, and Hannah Davis got in on the act
- 25 with an RBI single to give Booneville six runs. Garrett went
- 26 3-for-4 at the plate with four RBIs, and Burns was 2-for-4. Both
- 27 of them scored twice; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Booneville has returning talent; the Lady Blue
- 29 Devils will graduate six players, but return the core of the
- 30 lineup, including Burns and Garrett. "We're going to miss these
- 31 seniors. They have worked so hard for four years to get this
- 32 reward. We like this feeling too much" Taylor said; and
- 33 WHEREAS, Hallie Burns threw a complete-game one-hitter to
- 34 give Booneville a 1-0 win over Raleigh in Game 1 of MHSAA 3A
- 35 Fast-Pitch Softball Championship on May 12, 2021. She threw 66 of
- 36 her 81 pitches for a strike, walked one hitter and allowed one hit
- 37 with 14 strikeouts. She struck out every hitter in the Raleigh
- 38 lineup at least once; and
- 39 WHEREAS, a lot of folks might struggle in a big-game
- 40 environment in front of a lot of fans. Booneville's Hallie Burns
- 41 thrived on it; and
