SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 602

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE 2 PEARL RIVER COMMUNITY COLLEGE "WILDCATS" BASKETBALL TEAM AND HEAD 3 COACH SCOTTY FLETCHER FOR WINNING THEIR FIRST MISSISSIPPI 4 ASSOCIATION OF COMMUNITY COLLEGES CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP SINCE 5 1994.

6 WHEREAS, it's been a long time coming for Pearl River 7 Community College Women's Basketball Head Coach Scotty Fletcher 8 and his Wildcats, but on February 10, 2022, they claimed the 9 regular season Mississippi Association of Community Colleges 10 Conference (MACCC) Championship for the first time since 1994. 11 The Wildcats defeated the visiting Northeast Tigers 83-42 to earn 12 the honor; and

13 WHEREAS, "I didn't tell the girls until our shootaround that 14 we had a chance to make history tonight because I didn't want them 15 to feel pressured. From where we were seven years ago to be able 16 to be Conference Champions speaks volumes about the girls and 17 assistant coaches. I've been extremely blessed with great 18 players. We get the chance to hang a banner, get a Gold Ball and

That's incredible and to celebrate it 20 with these awesome girls means a lot," Coach Fletcher said; and WHEREAS, Pearl River (19-3 overall; 12-1 MACCC) was off and 21 running to start the Championship Game, immediately hitting from 22 downtown. Pearl River carried a 25-8 lead into the second 23 24 quarter. The Wildcats opened the second by taking a 28-10 lead when Otashae Burrage pump-faked to draw a defender's reaction 25 26 before stepping to the side and drilling a three-pointer. Pearl 27 River didn't let up, eventually going ahead 46-23 just before halftime. The Wildcats came out of the break exactly the same way 28 29 that they started the game as Otashae Burrage hit a three-pointer 30 to extend the lead to 52-24. Pearl River Community College 31 continued to pick up points at a rapid pace, ending the quarter on top 69-30. The final quarter of the night played out just like 32 33 the others, with Pearl River dominating until the final buzzer. 34 Pearl River ended the night with a convincing 82-42 victory. 35 Otashae Burrage and Halle Traylor tied for the team lead in points 36 with 12. When the starters were out and the bench players were 37 in, there was no drop-off; and
