6 WHEREAS, it's been a long time coming for Pearl River

7 Community College Women's Basketball Head Coach Scotty Fletcher

8 and his Wildcats, but on February 10, 2022, they claimed the

10 Conference (MACCC) Championship for the first time since 1994.

The Wildcats defeated the visiting Northeast Tigers 83-42 to earn 11

12 the honor; and

WHEREAS, "I didn't tell the girls until our shootaround that 13

we had a chance to make history tonight because I didn't want them 14

17 assistant coaches. I've been extremely blessed with great

players. We get the chance to hang a banner, get a Gold Ball and 18

- 19 put a ring on our finger. That's incredible and to celebrate it
- 20 with these awesome girls means a lot," Coach Fletcher said; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Pearl River (19-3 overall; 12-1 MACCC) was off and
- 22 running to start the Championship Game, immediately hitting from
- 23 downtown. Pearl River carried a 25-8 lead into the second
- 24 quarter. The Wildcats opened the second by taking a 28-10 lead
- 25 when Otashae Burrage pump-faked to draw a defender's reaction
- 26 before stepping to the side and drilling a three-pointer. Pearl
- 27 River didn't let up, eventually going ahead 46-23 just before
- 28 halftime. The Wildcats came out of the break exactly the same way
- 29 that they started the game as Otashae Burrage hit a three-pointer
- 30 to extend the lead to 52-24. Pearl River Community College
- 31 continued to pick up points at a rapid pace, ending the quarter on
- 32 top 69-30. The final quarter of the night played out just like
- 33 the others, with Pearl River dominating until the final buzzer.
- 34 Pearl River ended the night with a convincing 82-42 victory.
- 35 Otashae Burrage and Halle Traylor tied for the team lead in points
- 36 with 12. When the starters were out and the bench players were
- 37 in, there was no drop-off; and
