SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 1

1 2	A RESOLUTION TO AMEND SENATE RULE 65 TO PROVIDE FOR THE REMOVAL OF MEMBERS OF THE RULES COMMITTEE.
3	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
4	MISSISSIPPI, That Senate Rule 65 is amended to read as follows:
5	RULES COMMITTEE
6	65. (1) (a) There shall be a standing Committee on Rules
7	which shall consist of the President (who shall be a nonvoting
8	member), the President Pro Tempore, and four (4) Senators, each
9	having served at least four (4) years in the Senate, one (1) from
10	each congressional district of the state as constituted on January
11	1, 2004, to be selected by the Senators from their respective
12	congressional districts by caucus. Each congressional district
13	caucus shall hold an organizational meeting and shall elect a
14	chairman and vice chairman of the caucus. Meetings of the caucus
15	may be called at any time by the chairman or if requested by a
16	<u>majority of the caucus.</u> The voting precinct of the Senator * * *
17	shall determine the congressional district caucus in which the
18	Senator shall participate and for which the Senator may hold

- 19 membership on the Rules Committee. A Senator representing a
- 20 congressional district on the Rules Committee may be removed at
- 21 any time by a caucus vote of at least three-fourths (3/4) of the
- 22 Senators from his respective congressional district.
- 23 (b) The President Pro Tempore shall serve as Chairman
- 24 of the Rules Committee; the vice chairman shall be appointed by
- 25 the President Pro Tempore from among the Senators on the
- 26 committee.
- 27 (2) The Rules Committee shall, in addition to the functions
- 28 of a standing committee and any other responsibilities assigned by
- 29 the Senate, perform the following duties:
- 30 (a) Conduct the business affairs of the Senate;
- 31 (b) Pursuant to authority granted in Section 29-5-2,
- 32 Mississippi Code of 1972, assign such space in the Capitol or in
- 33 such other buildings or parts thereof as may be reserved for the
- 34 Senate and have complete control, authority and jurisdiction over
- 35 such rooms, chambers, offices and other areas. Any assignment of
- 36 space shall be subject to change by the Rules Committee. No other
- 37 branch of the government, or a department or agency thereof, shall
- 38 use any such room, chamber, office or other area without specific
- 39 written authorization from the Rules Committee. The Rules
- 40 Committee may delegate its powers with regard to any such room,
- 41 chamber, office or other area in connection with the use,
- 42 maintenance, repairing, construction, reconstruction and
- 43 refurbishing thereof in such a manner as it deems advisable;

- 47 organization, procedures, facilities and working conditions of the

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- 49 (f)Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5) for
- 50 the staffing of the office of the President and the office of the
- 51 President Pro Tempore, the Rules Committee shall have the
- 52 authority to employ all personnel necessary to execute the duties
- 53 and responsibilities of the Senate. Unless otherwise specifically
- 54 provided, the Rules Committee shall have full and exclusive
- 55 authority over the employees of the Senate. All such employees
- 56 shall serve at the pleasure of the Rules Committee. Complaints
- 57 with respect to any misconduct, inefficiency or omission by the
- 58 Secretary, the Sergeant-at-Arms or employees of the Senate shall
- 59 be heard by the Rules Committee, which may discharge the employees
- 60 therefor and may recommend to the full Senate the discharge of the
- 61 Secretary and the Sergeant-at-Arms;
- 62 Fix the salaries of the Senate officials and
- 63 employees;
- 64 (h) Assign news, radio and television reporters wishing
- 65 to take down or broadcast the debates and proceedings of the
- Senate, places in the Senate so as not to interfere with the 66
- 67 convenience of the Senate;



68	(i) Authorize the reimbursement of Senators and Senate
69	officials and employees who are required to travel in the
70	performance of their official duties. The Rules Committee may
71	establish regulations governing such travel which include the
72	prior approval of such travel by the Rules Committee. Senators
73	attending out-of-state conventions or conferences at state expense
74	shall make a report to the Senate, including the purpose, work and
75	recommendations resulting from the out-of-state meeting attended.
76	If more than one (1) Senator attends such convention or
77	conference, one $\underline{(1)}$ report may be made as the report of the
78	delegation; and

- Upon request of the chairman of any standing or select committee of the Senate, authorize expenses, to include per diem, mileage, meals and lodging, to be paid for members attending the meeting of any such committee or subcommittee thereof during the period in which the Legislature is not in session. Committee may adopt rules and regulations concerning time, places and number of meetings that may be held for which members will be compensated, such rules and regulations to require prior approval of meetings in order for members to be compensated.
- The committee may designate the Secretary of the Senate to be responsible for the day-to-day administration of the duties assigned to the committee and for implementing the policies of the committee adopted pursuant to this rule.

93 when the Legislature is not in session, members of the committee shall be compensated as provided in Section 25-3-69, Mississippi 94 Code of 1972, for each day spent in actual discharge of their 95 96 duties and shall receive the expense allowance and mileage 97 reimbursement provided in Section 5-1-47, Mississippi Code of 1972. No committee member may incur per diem, travel or expense 98 99 allowance unless authorized by vote at a meeting of the committee, 100 which action shall be recorded in the official minutes of the committee. The Rules Committee shall meet at such times as are 101 102 necessary for the proper exercise of its functions and may adopt 103 rules and regulations, not inconsistent with the rules of the 104 Senate, as it deems necessary for the efficient operation of the 105 committee. Action by a majority vote of the Rules Committee shall 106 be conclusive on any matter properly within the jurisdiction of 107 the committee.

The committee shall function on a year-round basis; and,

- 108 (5) In providing for the staffing of the President's (a) office, the Rules Committee shall fill up to eight (8) positions 109 110 when requested by the President, and the persons employed for such 111 positions shall be hired with the approval of the President. The 112 President shall recommend the compensation to be paid to the 113 President's staff, and the Rules Committee may pay the 114 compensation so established.
- 115 (b) In providing for the staffing of the President Pro 116 Tempore's office, the Rules Committee shall fill one (1) staff

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- 117 position as requested by the President Pro Tempore, and the person
- 118 employed for such position shall be hired with the approval of the
- 119 President Pro Tempore. The President Pro Tempore shall recommend
- 120 the compensation to be paid to the person so employed, and the
- 121 Rules Committee may pay the compensation so established.
