SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 16

- A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING JACKSON STATE
 UNIVERSITY "TIGERS" FOOTBALL AWARD-WINNING COACH DEION "COACH
 PRIME" SANDERS FOR A REMARKABLE PROGRAM RECORD 11-WIN SEASON AND
 FOR BEING NAMED THE 2021 SWAC COACH OF THE YEAR.

 WHEREAS, one of the biggest coaching hires in Football
 Championship Subdivision college football history has paid quick
- 7 dividends. Just over a year after the school made the legendary
- 8 cornerback a first-time head coach, the Tigers have set a program
- 9 record with 11 wins and captured the Southwestern Athletic
- 10 Conference (SWAC) Title for the first time since 2007. The Tigers
- 11 qualified for the Historically Black Colleges and Universities
- 12 Title Celebration Bowl for the first time; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Jackson State University certainly "believes" in the
- 14 results Coach Deion "Prime" Sanders, who was named the 2021
- 15 recipient of the Stats Perform FCS Eddie Robinson Award, which is
- 16 presented to the National Coach of the Year in the Division I
- 17 Subdivision. One of 17 finalists for the award, which is named
- 18 for legendary Grambling State Coach Eddie Robinson and celebrating

- 19 its 35th anniversary season, Sanders will be honored at the FCS
- 20 National Awards Banquet in Frisco, Texas; and
- 21 WHEREAS, "This is a team effort, it's a valiant effort, it
- 22 takes a lot, it does not just take me. I know it takes a
- 23 visionary, but people have to really support the vision. And
- 24 that's what we did," Sanders said. After Jackson State hired
- 25 Sanders in September 2020, he quickly instituted an "I Believe"
- 26 mantra to suggest positive days were ahead for a program that
- 27 didn't have a winning season since 2013; and
- 28 WHEREAS, with Sanders' son Shedeur, a freshman quarterback,
- 29 leading the offense as the 2021 Jerry Rice Award recipient, and
- 30 the defense ranking as the SWAC's best, Jackson State has gone
- 31 11-1, including 9-0 against conference opponents. While it's
- 32 unfolded, an average of 42,293 fans flocked to six home games a
- 33 single-season record for an FCS school; and
- 34 WHEREAS, after being named SWAC "Coach of the Year" and FCS
- 35 "Coach of the Year," and after winning a conference championship
- 36 with a chance to win the program's first HBCU national title in a
- 37 quarter century, it's time to consider whether Coach Sanders' is
- 38 transforming the power structure of college athletics. JSU
- 39 overshadowed every college football heavyweight on the first day
- 40 of the early signing period when five-star cornerback Travis
- 41 Hunter, the nation's No. 1 overall recruit, launched a new era in
- 42 the sport by switching his commitment from Florida State to the
- 43 Tigers; and

45 legend, JSU's own Walter Payton all came from historically black colleges and universities which have a rich history in football; 46 47 and 48 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize this 49 award-winning Coach who has brought honor and national attention to Jackson State University and to the Capital City: 50 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 51 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend and congratulate the 52 Jackson State University "Tigers" Football award-winning Coach 53 54 Deion "Coach Prime" Sanders for a remarkable program record 11-win 55 season and for winning the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) 56 Title for the first time since 2007, and extend to Coach Prime and his assistants, the team, parents, sponsors and support staff our 57 58 best wishes for future success. 59 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to 60 Deion "Coach Prime" Sanders for the JSU Tigers, JSU President, Thomas K.
