- 31 actively involved in the organization;
- She has also served as a member of the Board of Directors
- 33 for the Mississippi Nurses' Foundation and is a Past-President of
- 34 the National Alumni Association of Mississippi University for
- 35 Women, commonly known as The W;
- She and her family own and operate three Cups coffee shop
- 37 franchises in the Jackson, Mississippi, metro area with two more
- 38 shops scheduled to open soon; and

- 40 Leading Businesswomen" in recognition of her accomplishments as an
- 41 author, former Newspaper Reporter, Editor and Television Host; and
