SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 38

1 A RESOLUTION PAYING TRIBUTE TO THE LIFE AND MEDICAL LEGACY OF
2 DR. GUSTAVUS ADOLPHUS "SONNY" RUSH III WHO FOUNDED THE ORTHOPEDIC
3 SPORTS MEDICINE PROGRAM AT RUSH HOSPITAL IN MERIDIAN, MISSISSIPPI,
4 AND EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON HIS
5 PASSING.

6 WHEREAS, we join the medical community and the citizens of
7 Meridian, Mississippi, in mourning the passing of respected
8 Orthopedic Surgeon Dr. Gustavus Rush III on August 20, 2021; and

9 WHEREAS, Dr. Gustavus Adolphus "Sonny" Rush III was born on
10 September 29, 1952, in Meridian, Mississippi. He graduated from
11 Meridian High School in 1970 as Class President. Dr. Rush
12 attended the University of Mississippi from 1970-1974. He was a
13 member of Phi Delta Theta Fraternity, where he was fondly known as
14 "The Governor." Dr. Rush received his Doctorate of Medicine at
15 the University of Mississippi Medical Center in Jackson,
16 Mississippi, in 1978, and completed his residency training in
17 Orthopedic Surgery and Sports Medicine at Ochsner Foundation
18 Hospital in New Orleans in 1984, where he served as Chief
19 Orthopedic Resident; and



20 WHEREAS, after completing his residency in 1984, Dr. Rush
21 joined Rush Foundation Hospital as a third generation of Rush
22 physicians, and founded the Rush Orthopaedic Program. He spent
23 his entire 38-year career at Rush Hospital. During this time, he
24 improved and enriched the lives of countless patients and friends.
25 Dr. Rush performed over 20,000 surgeries during his career and had
26 many other tremendous work accomplishments. In 1987, he founded
27 the Rush Sports Medicine Team, a group of orthopaedic surgeons,
28 physical therapists and athletic trainers who supported over 40
29 local high schools and colleges in Mississippi and West Alabama.
30 In 1992, he founded Rush Sports Medicine Research and Development.
31 Inspired by his desire to protect young athletes, he patented
32 several cutting-edge technologies such as protective helmets and
33 concussion sensors; and

34 WHEREAS, Dr. Sonny, as he was affectionally known by his
35 patients, treated work like a blessing, none of it like a chore.
36 To him, being a doctor was every bit as fun and enjoyable as his
37 hobbies. It is no coincidence that he routinely had clinic on
38 late Friday afternoons. He loved taking care of patients, and his
39 life was firmly dedicated to that; and

40 WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife of 40 years, Karen Rush;
41 five children: Heath Rush, Lane Rush (Caroline), Alston Rush
42 (Jena), Logan Rush (Anne) and Callie Waite (Tanner); seven
43 grandchildren: Lane Rush, Jr., Luke Rush, Ben Rush, Lillian Rush,
44 Henry Rush, Clara Jane Rush and Drew Rush; and siblings, Diane



45 Douglas (Pete) and Harriette Carney (Bill). He is preceded in
46 death by his mother and father, Gustavus Adolphus Rush, Jr., and
47 Virginia Arline Rush; and sister, Jeannine Rush Savell; and

48 WHEREAS, we pay tribute and cherish fondly the memory of this
49 most respected medical professional and public-spirited citizen of
50 Mississippi, whose leadership and enormous civic energy will be
51 missed:

52 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
53 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby pay tribute to the life and medical
54 legacy of Dr. Gustavus Adolphus "Sonny" Rush III who founded the
55 Orthopedic Sports Medicine Program at Rush Hospital in Meridian,
56 Mississippi, and express the deepest sympathy to his family and
57 friends upon his passing.

58 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
59 the family of Dr. Gustavus Adolphus "Sonny" Rush III, forwarded to
60 the Board of Trustees of Rush Memorial Hospital, and made
