AMENDMENT NO. 1

101 Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1 102 and allocated to the Gulf Coast Research Laboratory, the Board of 103 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall allocate 104 One Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00) for Sea 105

Grants matching for the Fiscal Year 2023.

106 Provided further, it is the intention of the Legislature, in 107 the event budget reductions are imposed on the Gulf Coast Research 108 Laboratory by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 109 Higher Learning, as a result of the Governor ordering budget reductions under the provisions of Section 27-104-13 or 31-17-123, 110 111 Mississippi Code of 1972, the same percent reduction will be 112 applied to those state funds identified in this section for Sea 113 Grant match.

It is the intent of the Legislature that no general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

After the Mississippi State Chemical Laboratory has provided the maximum amount of services which may be provided free of charge under the provisions of Section 57-21-11(c), Mississippi Code of 1972, the laboratory shall not provide any additional services from the funds appropriated under the provisions of Sections 1 and 2 if any charges for such services previously provided are more than ninety (90) days past due. - 156 budget requests of the individual institutes, laboratories and

- 158 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
- 159 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 160 provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process.
- 161 **SECTION 8.** The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of
- 162 Higher Learning shall report yearly to the Legislature any
- 163 institution not in compliance with Section 97-11-51, Mississippi
- 164 Code of 1972, which prohibits deficit spending.
- 165 **SECTION 9.** Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and
- 166 paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be
- in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of
- 168 Mississippi and Section 25-4-105, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 169 **SECTION 10.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 170 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 171 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 172 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 173 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 174 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 175 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 176 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 11. None of the funds appropriated and/or authorized for expenditure under this act shall be used for research in which a human embryo is killed or destroyed.

SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after June 29, 2022.
