House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3017

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Board of Animal Health
9	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending
10	June 30, 2023\$ 1,310,437.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
13	source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available
14	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Board
15	of Animal Health, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and
16	ending June 30, 2023\$ 758,857.00.
17	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
18	this act, the following positions are authorized:
19	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
20	Permanent: Full Time 20
21	Part Time 0
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22	Time-Limited: Full Time 5
23	Part Time 0
24	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
25	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
26	Services for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 funds
27	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
28	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the Mississippi
29	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
30	personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the
31	State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
32	shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
33	based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
34	agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
35	Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the
36	Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023
37	projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
38	shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
39	of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.
40	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
41	the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
42	allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
43	Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
44	approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
45	Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
46	approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

- 47 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 48 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 50 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 51 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 52 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 54 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 55 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 56 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 57 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 58 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
- 59 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- 60 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
- 61 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
- 62 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
- 63 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 64 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 65 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 66 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 67 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 68 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 69 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 70 made without competitive bids.
- 71 **SECTION 5.** The Mississippi Board of Animal Health is
- 72 authorized to accept and expend any grant, donation, or

- 73 contribution from any individual, public or private organization,
- 74 or government entity for purposes of defraying the operational
- 75 costs of the department. Such grants, donations or contributions
- 76 shall be received and expended under the rules and regulations of
- the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner 77
- consistent with the escalation of federal funds not to exceed Five 78
- 79 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00).
- 80 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 81 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 82
- 83 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 84
- or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 85
- 86 actions contrary to this provision.
- SECTION 7. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 87
- 88 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 89 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 90
- 91 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 92 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
- 93 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 94 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after
- 95 June 29, 2022.
