House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3026

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
6	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
7	defraying the expenses incurred by the Mississippi Workers'
8	Compensation Commission for the fiscal year beginning
9	July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023\$ 5,411,751.00.
LO	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L1	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
L2	Treasury to the credit of the Second Injury Fund (Fund Number
L3	3352300000) for the purpose of making payments under the
L 4	provisions of Section 71-3-73, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the
L5	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
L 6	\$ 100,000.00
L7	SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
L8	act, the following positions are authorized:

24	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
25	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
26	Services for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 funds
27	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
28	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the Mississippi
29	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
30	personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the
31	State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
32	shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
33	based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
34	agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
35	Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the
36	Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023
37	projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
38	shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
39	of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.
40	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
41	the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
42	allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
43	Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
44	approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
45	Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
46	approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
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- 47 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- appropriated level. 48
- 49 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 50 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 51 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 52
- 53 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 54 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as 55
- 56 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 57 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered 58
- 59 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- 60 It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
- 61 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
- minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board. 62
- 63 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that with
- the funds appropriated in Section 1, the Mississippi Workers' 64
- 65 Compensation Commission shall enter into a contract with the
- 66 industrial private sector for the purpose of implementing a safety
- 67 education and training program.
- 68 SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 69
- 70 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 71 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 72 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

107	agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
108	Committee for Fiscal Year 2024.
109	SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that
110	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
111	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
112	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
113	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
114	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
115	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
116	made without competitive bids.
117	SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
118	salary of the Workers' Compensation Commission members shall be
119	equal and the salary of the Commission Chairman shall exceed these
120	salaries as approved by the State Personnel Board.
121	SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
122	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
123	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency

shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their

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appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

128 The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 129 130 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 131 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 132 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 133 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 134 SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after 135 June 29, 2022. 136
