House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3034

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

22 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the Mississippi 23 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the 24 25 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board 26 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs 27 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for 28 29 Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the 30 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 31 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions 32 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception 33 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

34 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 35 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 36 37 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 38 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 39 40 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 41 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 42 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

S. B. 3034 PAGE 2 47 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in 48 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating 49 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as 50 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

51 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of 52 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered 53 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation 54 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the 55 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the 56 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

57 SECTION 3. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 58 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 59 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 60 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 61 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 62 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted 63 performance measures provided below:

93	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that		
94	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the		
95	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things		
96	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,		
97	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind		
98	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to

99 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 100 made without competitive bids.

101 It is the intention of the Legislature that the SECTION 5. 102 Board of Pharmacy shall maintain complete accounting and personnel 103 records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under 104 this act and that such records shall be in the same format and 105 level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2022. It is further 106 the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request 107 for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the 108 109 format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 110 budget request process.

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

SECTION 7. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

S. B. 3034 PAGE 5 SECTION 8. In accordance with Section 73-21-127(h), Mississippi Code of 1972, the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy may accept and expend funds from any other state agency to defray the expenses of the Prescription Monitoring Program.

128 **SECTION 9.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 129 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after 130 June 29, 2022.
