House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3048

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4	SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as		
5	may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the		
6	State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the		
7	expenses of the Mississippi Development Authority for the fiscal		
8	year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023		
9	\$ 20,438,373.00.		
10	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be		
11	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State		
12	Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Development Authority or		
13	the appropriate special fund for the purpose of defraying the		
14	expenses incurred in the operation of the various divisions of the		
15	authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending		
16	June 30, 2023\$ 82,963,650.00.		
17	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of		
18	this act, the following positions are authorized:		
19	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:		
20	Permanent: Full Time 190		
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With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 24 25 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal Services for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 funds 26 27 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the Mississippi 28 29 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 30 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board 31 32 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs 33 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for 34 35 Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 36 37 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception 38 39 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency. 40 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 41 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or

42 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 43 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 44 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 45 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 46 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

47 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 48 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

57 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of 58 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered 59 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation 60 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the 61 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the 62 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

63 SECTION 4. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 64 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 65 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 66 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 67 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 68 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted 69 performance measures provided below:

111 A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets 112 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the 113 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 114 Committee for Fiscal Year 2024.

115 **SECTION 5.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the 116 amount of Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$800,000.00) shall be 117 provided from the Mississippi Department of Transportation to 118 defray the expenses of the Mississippi Development Authority in 119 operating the state welcome centers.

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Development Authority shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal S. B. 3048

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Year 2022. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process.

130 SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 131 the amount of Four Million Eight Hundred Seventy-six Thousand Two 132 Hundred Ninety-eight Dollars (\$4,876,298.00), or so much thereof 133 as may be necessary, is provided for the purpose of supporting 134 Mississippi Tourism Advertising and Promotion for Fiscal Year 135 2023, and shall not be expended for any type of cultural exchange 136 program. Of the funds appropriated herein and allocated within 137 this section, Two Hundred Ninety-nine Thousand Dollars 138 (\$299,000.00) is provided for Tourism Grant Development Awards.

139 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 140 of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members 141 of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate 142 are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony 143 announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public 144 announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening 145 of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has 146 made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or 147 any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following 148 language: "Funds were made available for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature." 149

150 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that 151 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 152 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 153 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 154 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 155 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 156 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 157 made without competitive bids.

158 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, One 159 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is provided for the 160 Mississippi Delta National Heritage Areas.

161 **SECTION 11.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, One 162 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is provided for the 163 Mississippi Hills National Heritage Area.

The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 164 SECTION 12. 165 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital 166 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the Mississippi 167 Development Authority for the purpose of reauthorizing the 168 expenditure of Capital Expense Funds for the MDA Site Development 169 Grant Program Fund, as authorized in Senate Bill No. 2951, 2021 170 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and 171 ending June 30, 2023.....\$ 10,000,000.00 172 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the

173 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended 174 exceed the unexpended balance of June 30, 2022.

175 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 176 Mississippi Development Authority is hereby authorized to 177 escalate, budget, and expend funds from any source not to exceed 178 Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) in accordance with rules and 179 regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a 180 manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

181 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 182 Mississippi Development Authority shall submit a notification of 183 any General Fund Transfers out of the major category Subsidies 184 into any other major categories to the Legislative Budget Office.

185 **SECTION 15.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Twenty 186 Thousand Twenty-five Dollars (\$20,025.00) shall be provided for 187 the support of the Mississippi River Parkway Commission.

188 SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Zero
189 Dollars (\$0.00) shall be transferred to Innovate Mississippi.

SECTION 17. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, One Hundred Fifty-six Thousand Dollars (\$156,000.00) is provided for the Energy High School Academy, established by Senate Bill No. 2928, 2019 Regular Session.

194 SECTION 18. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 195 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital 196 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the Mississippi 197 Development Authority for the purpose of reauthorizing the 198 expenditure of Capital Expense Funds for the Air Service 199 Development Act, as authorized in Senate Bill No. 2951, 2021

 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and

 201
 ending June 30, 2023.....\$
 246,431.00.

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended exceed the unexpended balance of June 30, 2022.

SECTION 19. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Development Authority may provide operational support to any park operated by the United States National Park Service in Mississippi during the event of a government shutdown that materially affects the operations of such park.

210 **SECTION 20.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 211 212 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 213 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 214 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 215 216 SECTION 21. This act shall take effect and be in force from 217 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after 218 June 29, 2022.
