COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO**

Senate Bill No. 3049

**Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting
in lieu thereof the following:**

6 **SECTION 1.** The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
8 Gulf Coast Restoration Fund, as created in Section 57-119-1
9 Mississippi Code of 1972, not otherwise appropriated to the
10 Mississippi Development Authority. These funds are provided for
11 projects as outlined in Section 57-119-9, Mississippi Code of
12 1972, for assistance to local units of government,
13 non-governmental organizations, institutions of higher learning,
14 community colleges, ports, airports, public-private partnerships,
15 private for-profit entities, private nonprofit entities and local



16 economic development entities for the fiscal year beginning July
17 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.....\$ 0.00.

18 **SECTION 2.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
19 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Gulf Coast
20 Restoration Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Mississippi
21 Development Authority for the purpose of reauthorizing the
22 expenditure of Gulf Coast Restoration Fund, as authorized in
23 Senate Bill No. 2951, 2021 Regular Session, for the fiscal year
24 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.....

167 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the
168 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
169 exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 2022.

170 Of the funds reappropriated in this section the following
171 sums are provided for the following programs:

173 and the Air Service Development Incentive
174 Program.....\$2,500,000.00.

175 (b) For the Mississippi Development Authority
176 and the Quality of Place Incentives Program.....\$3,000,000.00.

177 Of these funds, One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) is
178 provided for the development of a South Mississippi defense and
179 space industry strategy for small companies to compete for defense
180 related contracts to include government, industry and academia.

181 **SECTION 5.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
182 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Gulf Coast
183 Restoration Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Mississippi
184 Development Authority for the purpose of reauthorizing the
185 expenditure of Gulf Coast Restoration Fund, as authorized in
186 Senate Bill No. 2977, 2020 Regular Session, for the fiscal year
187 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.....
188\$500,000.00.

189 These funds are provided for Mississippi Development
190 Authority's administrative expenses as outlined in Section



191 57-119-7, Mississippi Code of 1972. Prior to expending any funds
192 in this section, the Mississippi Development Authority shall
193 implement a project management system that provides for full
194 tracking and reporting of the amounts appropriated, reappropriated
195 and expended for each project funded by the Gulf Coast Restoration
196 Fund in this act. The Mississippi Development Authority shall
197 provide quarterly reports on the status of these projects to the
198 Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and
199 Administration. The Mississippi Development Authority shall
200 provide the Joint Legislative Budget Committee a detailed report
201 and other such related information on each project's expenditures
202 with the subsequent fiscal year's budget submission.

203 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the
204 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
205 exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 2022.

206 **SECTION 6.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
207 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
208 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
209 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
210 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
211 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

212 **SECTION 7.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
213 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after
214 June 29, 2022.
