Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1240

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

1 AMEND by inserting the following language on line 148 and 2 renumber subsequent sections accordingly:

3 SECTION *. Section 37-7-345, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
4 amended as follows:

5 37-7-345. (1) A regional educational service agency (RESA) may be established in a region of the state when twelve (12) or 6 more school districts determine there are benefits and services 7 that can be derived from the collective and collaborative 8 9 formation of an agency for the purpose of pooling and leveraging 10 resources for the common benefit of students, teachers, 11 administrators and taxpayers. An educational service agency shall 12 be incorporated in the State of Mississippi and organized under 13 the laws of the State of Mississippi as a nonprofit corporation. The educational service agency shall obtain 501(c)(3) status with 14 the Internal Revenue Service. 15

16 (2) The operation and management of the educational service 17 agency shall be the responsibility of a public advisory board 18 composed of the superintendents of schools or their designees from 19 each participating school district. H. B. 1240 PAGE 1 (3) A board of directors shall be elected on an annual basis
from the advisory board to oversee the day-to-day operations of
the agency.

(4) The executive board shall hire an executive director to
serve as the executive agent of the board of the regional
educational service agency.

26 The board of directors of a regional educational service (5)27 agency shall have the authority to establish policies for the regional educational service to determine the programs and 28 29 services to be provided, to employ staff, to prepare and expend 30 the budget, to provide for financing programs and projects of the regional educational service agency, and to annually evaluate the 31 32 performance of the agency. The board may purchase, hold, encumber and dispose of real property, in the name of the agency, for use 33 as its office or for any educational service provided by the 34 35 agency.

36 (6) The educational service agency is authorized and
37 empowered to: develop, manage and provide support services and/or
38 programs as determined by the needs of the local school districts
39 <u>and pre-school programs to prepare students for entry into public</u>
40 <u>schools</u>. Educational service agencies (ESAs) shall:

41 (a) Act primarily as service agencies in providing
42 services and/or programs as identified and requested by member
43 school districts <u>and state agencies such as the Mississippi</u>
44 <u>Department of Education and the Mississippi Department of Human</u> H. B. 1240 PAGE 2 45 <u>Services</u> (services may include, but are not limited to, 46 professional development, instructional materials, educational 47 technology, curriculum development and alternative educational 48 programs);

(b) Provide for economy, efficiency and cost-effectiveness in the cooperative delivery and purchase or lease of educational services, materials and products (services may include, but are not limited to, purchasing cooperatives, insurance cooperatives, business manager services, auditing and accounting services, school safety/risk prevention, and data processing and student records);

(c) Provide administrative services (services may include, but are not limited to, communications/public information, employee background checks, grants management, printing/publications and internships);

(d) Provide educational services through leadership,
research and development in <u>pre-school</u>, elementary and secondary
education;

63 Act in a cooperative and supportive role, including (e) 64 contracting, with the Mississippi Department of Education, Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning, Mississippi community 65 66 colleges and other state educational organizations in the development and implementation of long-range plans, strategies and 67 68 goals for the enhancement of educational opportunities in pre-69 school, elementary and secondary education; and н. в. 1240 PAGE 3

(f) Serve, when appropriate and as funds become available, as a repository, clearinghouse and administrator of federal, state, local and private funds on behalf of school districts which choose to participate in special programs, projects or grants in order to enhance the quality of education in Mississippi schools.

76 (7) The State Board of Education shall have the authority to
77 contract with and provide funds to regional educational service
78 agencies for any education-related service.

79 FURTHER, AMEND the title to conform.
