## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1423

## TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 31 a presiding justice in this subsection (1), and One Hundred Twelve
- 32 Thousand Five Hundred Thirty Dollars (\$112,530.00) of the salary
- 33 of an associate justice in this subsection (1) shall be paid from
- 34 general fund monies; in addition, the Legislature shall
- 35 appropriate annually from the Judicial System Operation Fund a sum
- 36 sufficient to increase the salary of the Chief Justice, a
- 37 presiding justice and an associate justice to the levels set forth
- 38 in this subsection (1).
- The fixed salaries as specified in this subsection (1) shall
- 40 be the exclusive and total compensation which can be reported to
- 41 the Public Employees' Retirement System for retirement purposes;
- 42 however, any judge in office on December 31, 2003, may continue to
- 43 report his expense allowance as part of his compensation for
- 44 retirement purposes.

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         The fixed salaries in this subsection (2) shall be paid from
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    the State General Fund and from the Judicial System Operation Fund
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    created under Section 9-21-45. No less than One Hundred Eight
    Thousand One Hundred Thirty Dollars ($108,130.00) of the Chief
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    Judge's salary in this subsection (2) shall be paid from general
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    fund monies; in addition, the Legislature shall appropriate
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    annually from the Judicial System Operation Fund a sum sufficient
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    to increase the Chief Judge's salary to the level set forth in
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    this subsection (2). No less than One Hundred Five Thousand Fifty
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    Dollars ($105,050.00) of the salary of an associate judge in this
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    subsection (2) shall be paid from general fund monies; in
    addition, the Legislature shall appropriate annually from the
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    Judicial System Operation Fund a sum sufficient to increase the
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    salary of an associate judge to the level set forth in this
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    subsection (2).
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         The fixed salaries as specified in this subsection (2) shall
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    be the exclusive and total compensation which can be reported to
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    the Public Employees' Retirement System for retirement purposes;
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however, any judge in office on December 31, 2003, may continue to

- In addition to their present official duties, the circuit and

- 85 of Courts, or such other additional duties as may be assigned by
- 86 the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. For such extra services
- 87 each judge \* \* \* shall receive a sum sufficient to aggregate, per
- 88 annum, the salaries set forth in this subsection (3).
- The fixed salaries in this subsection (3) shall be paid from
- 90 the State General Fund and from the Judicial System Operation Fund
- 91 created under Section 9-21-45. No less than One Hundred Four
- 92 Thousand One Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$104,170.00) of the salary
- 93 of a chancery or circuit judge in this subsection (3) shall be
- 94 paid from general fund monies; in addition, the Legislature shall
- 95 appropriate annually from the Judicial System Operation Fund a sum
- 96 sufficient to increase the salary of a chancery or circuit judge
- 97 to the levels set forth in this subsection (3).
- 98 (4) From and after January 1, 2019, and every four (4) years
- 99 thereafter, the annual salaries of the judges in subsections (1),

- 100 (2) and (3) shall be fixed at the level of compensation
- 101 recommended by the State Personnel Board according to the board's

- 118 (7) The annual salary of the full-time legal assistants
- 119 shall be not less than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) nor
- 120 more than eighty percent (80%) of the salary of the district
- 121 attorney for legal assistants who have been licensed to practice
- law for five (5) years or less; eighty-five percent (85%) of the
- 123 salary of the district attorney for legal assistants who have been
- 124 licensed to practice law for at least five (5) years but less than
- 125 fifteen (15) years; and ninety percent (90%) of the salary of the

- 126 district attorney for legal assistants who have been licensed to
- 127 practice law for at least fifteen (15) years or more.
- 128 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 129 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed on June 30, 2022.

## Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-35, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF THE JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT, THE JUDGES OF THE COURT OF APPEALS, THE CHANCERY AND CIRCUIT COURT JUDGES, AND THE DISTRICT ATTORNEYS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
