

22 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the
23 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
24 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
25 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
26 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
27 Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the
28 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023
29 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
30 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
31 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

32 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
33 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
34 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
35 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
36 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
37 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
38 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
39 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
40 appropriated level.

41 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
42 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
43 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
44 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

45 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
46 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating

47 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
48 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

49 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
50 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
51 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
52 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
53 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
54 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

55 **SECTION 3.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
56 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
57 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
58 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
59 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
60 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
61 performance measures provided below:

71 A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
72 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the

73 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
74 Committee for Fiscal Year 2024.

75 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
76 State Board of Barber Examiners shall maintain complete accounting
77 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
78 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
79 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
80 2022. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
81 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be submitted to
82 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
83 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
84 during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process.

85 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
86 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
87 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
88 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
89 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
90 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
91 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
92 made without competitive bids.

93 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
94 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
95 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
96 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
97 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally

98 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
99 actions contrary to this provision.

100 **SECTION 7.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
101 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
102 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
103 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
104 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
105 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

106 **SECTION 8.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
107 and after July 1, 2022.

**Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and
inserting in lieu thereof the following:**
