103 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 104 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 105 Services for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 funds 106 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 107 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the Mississippi 108 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 109 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board 110 111 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the 112 113 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the 114

115 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 116 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions 117 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception 118 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

119 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 120 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 121 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 122 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 123 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 124 125 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 126 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 127 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the

140 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the 141 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

142 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Health shall maintain complete accounting and 143 144 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 145 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 146 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2022. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 147 148 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be submitted to 149 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 150 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 151 during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process.

152 SECTION 9. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 153 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 154 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 155 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 156 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 157 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted 158 performance measures provided below:

SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that with the funds provided herein, the State Department of Health may provide and administer without charge, Hepatitis B vaccinations to Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel who are in need of such vaccinations through job related exposure.

248 SECTION 11. In addition to all other sums heretofore 249 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 250 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury 251 to the credit of the Local Governments and Rural Water Systems 252 Emergency Loan Fund, and the Local Governments and Rural Water 253 System Improvements Revolving Loan Fund as authorized in Chapter 254 521, Laws of 1995, to the State Department of Health for the 255 purpose of defraying the expenses of the Local Governments and 256 Rural Water Systems Improvements Board, for the fiscal year 257 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023..... 258\$ 34,342,704.00. SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One 259 260 Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall come from the Department of 261 Human Services, Child Care Development Fund or other appropriate 262 special funds for the purpose of child care licensure. These 263 funds are to be transferred to the State Department of Health no

264 later than July 31, 2022. The State Department of Health shall 265 make a complete accounting of the uses of these funds to the 266 Department of Human Services.

267 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 268 State Department of Health shall expend not more than Fifty 269 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) of the funds appropriated herein for 270 providing the oil known as "Lorenzo's Oil" for the treatment of 271 the genetic disorder adrenoleukodystrophy (ALD), to children and 272 Mississippi residents over the age of twenty-one (21) who have the 273 genetic disorder adrenoleukodystrophy and for whom Medicaid does 274 not reimburse the cost of providing the oil. The department may 275 also provide needed pathology and biannual MRI exams.

SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00) are provided for the purpose of purchasing AIDS drugs and other necessary AIDS related medical services.

280 **SECTION 15.** Of the funds appropriated herein, Two Hundred 281 Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) is provided for the Breast and 282 Cervical Cancer Program.

SECTION 16. In addition to all other funds heretofore appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Burn Care Fund which is comprised of special source funds collected by or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of funding reimbursement for

289 uncompensated medical care to Mississippi burn victims through the 290 trauma care system at in-state burn facilities including the 291 Joseph M. Still Burn and Reconstruction Center at Merit Health 292 Central or for uncompensated aero medical transportation to 293 out-of-state qualified United States Burn Care facilities, and 294 such other provisions necessary to provide burn care for 295 Mississippi residents, including reimbursement for travel, 296 lodgings, meals and other reasonable travel-related expenses 297 incurred by burn victims, family members and/or caregivers, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.. 298 299 1,000,000.00.

300 SECTION 17. It is the intention of the Legislature that 301 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 302 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 303 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 304 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 305 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 306 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 307 made without competitive bids.

308 **SECTION 18.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 309 Mississippi Department of Health shall implement same day service 310 to receive birth and death certificates.

311 SECTION 19. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 312 Mississippi State Department of Health shall provide the Joint 313 Legislative Budget Committee a report of all grants received by

314 September 15, 2022. This notification will consist of the name of 315 the grant and agency or nonprofit making the award, the award 316 amount, and a short list of goals to be achieved.

317 **SECTION 20.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 318 Mississippi State Department of Health shall be the fiscal agent 319 in all allowable grants awarded.

320 SECTION 21. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00) shall come from the 321 322 Department of Education for the purpose of maintenance of effort 323 for the Early Intervention Program. These funds are to be 324 transferred to the State Department of Health no later than 325 December 31, 2022. The State Department of Health shall make a 326 complete accounting of the uses of these funds to the Department 327 of Education.

328 The Mississippi Department of Health is SECTION 22. 329 authorized to obtain a line of credit through the State Treasurer 330 from the Working Cash-Stabilization Fund or any other special 331 source funds maintained in the State Treasury in an amount not 332 exceeding Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) to fund shortfalls 333 which, from time to time, may occur due to insufficient working 334 cash spent in anticipation of receiving federal reimbursement. 335 The length of indebtedness under this provision shall not carry 336 past the end of the quarter following the loan origination. Loan 337 proceeds shall be received by the State Treasurer and shall be placed in a Mississippi Department of Health designated special 338

fund account. The division may pledge as security for such interim financing future funds that will be received by the division. Any such loans shall be repaid from the first available funds received by the department in the manner of and subject to the same terms provided in this section.

344 SECTION 23. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 345 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 346 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 347 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their 348 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 349 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 350 actions contrary to this provision.

351 SECTION 24. With the funds appropriated herein, it is the 352 intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Department of 353 Health is authorized to set the compensation of all nurse PINs, 354 Epidemiologists and Disease Intervention Specialist Series based 355 on the education and experience of the incumbent not to exceed the 356 end salary as established by the State Personnel Board.

357 SECTION 25. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 358 Chairman of the Board of Health may appoint an official 359 replacement or representative with voting privileges to the 360 Advisory Board of the Office of Mississippi Physician Workforce.

361 **SECTION 26.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 362 State Health Officer shall have the authority to transfer cash 363 from one special fund treasury fund to another special fund

treasury fund under the control of the Department of Health. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the State Health Officer shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the transfer.

370 SECTION 27. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is 371 the intention of the Legislature that Eight Hundred Fifty-nine 372 Thousand Nine Hundred Three Dollars (\$859,903.00) shall be 373 allocated to the Domestic Violence program that is supported from 374 General Fund court assessments.

375 It is the intent of the Legislature that the SECTION 28. 376 Mississippi State Department of Health shall have authority to 377 escalate the various budgets in both funds and positions, with the 378 approval of the State Fiscal Officer, from any special funds 379 collected or available for HIV medical or support services, 380 clinical quality management, and administrative expenses not to 381 exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00), to the agency for 382 expenditure. Upon such approval, the Mississippi State Department 383 of Health may expend such funds in the manner authorized by law. 384 Funds may be made available to local HIV/AIDS service providers. 385 The Executive Director of the Mississippi State Department of 386 Health shall submit to the Department of Finance and

387 Administration a certified statement providing a detailed 388 explanation for any escalation, including a justification for the

389 establishment of any new positions or reclassification of existing 390 positions.

391 SECTION 29. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, an 392 amount not to exceed Three Million Two Hundred Forty Thousand 393 Dollars (\$3,240,000.00) may be used to purchase accumulated 394 compensatory time incurred before June 30, 2023, by employees who 395 are activated under emergency orders in response to the COVID-19 396 pandemic.

397 The money herein appropriated shall be paid by SECTION 30. 398 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 399 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 400 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 401 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 402 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 403 This act shall take effect and be in force from SECTION 31. 404 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed June 29, 2022.
