## HOUSE BILL NO. 41

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
TO AUTHORIZE THE SHERIFF OF RANKIN COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, AND HIS
DEPUTIES TO USE RADAR SPEED DETECTION EQUIPMENT UPON THE PUBLIC
STREETS, ROADS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE COUNTY LYING OUTSIDE OF THE
LIMITS OF ANY INCORPORATED AREAS WITHIN THE COUNTY; TO PROVIDE
THAT SUCH AUTHORITY SHALL BE SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE QUALIFIED
ELECTORS OF THE COUNTY UPON A REFERENDUM HELD ON THE QUESTION OF
THE UTILIZATION OF SUCH EQUIPMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 10 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 11 amended as follows:
- 12 63-3-519. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person or peace
- 13 officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway
- 14 Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of
- 15 radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or
- 16 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used:
- 17 (a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a
- 18 municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more,
- 19 according to the latest federal decennial census, according to the
- 20 latest or a previous federal census upon the public streets of the
- 21 municipality, but in no case where the latest federal census

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- 23 hundred (1,500);
- 24 (b) By any college or university campus police force
- 25 within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand
- 26 (2,000) students are enrolled;
- 27 (c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any
- 28 municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand
- 29 (15,000) according to the latest federal <u>decennial</u> census on
- 30 federally designated highways lying within the corporate
- 31 limits \* \* \*<u>;</u> or
- 32 (d) Subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of this
- 33 section, by the sheriff of Rankin County and his deputies of any
- 34 county on any public road, street or highway under the
- 35 jurisdiction of the county, which road, street or highway is
- 36 located outside the corporate limits of the municipality.
- 37 (2) (a) The board of supervisors of Rankin County, in its
- 38 discretion, by order duly adopted and entered upon its minutes,
- 39 may authorize the use of radar speed detection devices by the
- 40 sheriff and his deputies on county roads, streets and highways as
- 41 described under paragraph (1)(d) of this section. However, before
- 42 such order may become effective, the question of whether or not
- 43 the sheriff and his deputies may use radar speed detection devices
- 44 on the county roads must be submitted to and approved by a vote of
- 45 the qualified electors of the county. The question may be
- 46 submitted at a regularly scheduled election or at a special

47	election to be held for such purpose throughout the county. The
48	election shall be held and conducted by the county election
49	commissioners on a date fixed by the order of the board of
50	supervisors. Notice of the election must be given by publishing
51	the notice once each week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks
52	in some newspaper published in the county or, if no newspaper be
53	published therein, by publishing the notice in a newspaper in an
54	adjoining county having a general circulation in the county
55	involved. The election may be held not earlier than seven (7)
56	days from the last publication of the notice and shall be held and
57	conducted, as far as practicable, in the same manner as is
58	provided by law for the holding of general elections. The ballots
59	used at the election must contain a brief statement of the
60	proposition submitted and, on separate lines, the words "I vote
61	FOR the authority of the sheriff and his deputies to use radar
62	speed detection devices on county roads ( $\checkmark$ )" "I vote AGAINST the
63	authority of the sheriff and his deputies to use radar speed
64	detection devices on county roads (X)" with appropriate boxes in
65	which the voters may express their choice.
66	(b) The election commissioners shall canvass and
67	determine the results of the election, and shall certify the
68	results to the board of supervisors which shall adopt and spread
69	upon its minutes an order declaring the results. If, in such
70	election, a majority of the qualified electors participating
71	therein shall vote in favor of the proposition, then the order

	72	adopted	by	the	board	of	supervisors	authorizind	f the	sheriff	and
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- 73 his deputies to use radar speed detection devices on county roads,
- 74 streets and highways outside the corporate limits of a
- 75 municipality shall become effective on the date set forth in the
- 76 order. If, on the other hand, a majority of the qualified
- 77 electors participating in the election vote against the
- 78 proposition, then the provisions of paragraph (1)(d) of this
- 79 section shall not be applicable in such county.
- 80 (3) The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol shall be
- 81 immediately notified by municipal law enforcement of any road
- 82 blockages or emergencies occurring on any federally designated
- 83 limited-access highways lying within the corporate limits.
- 84 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 85 and after July 1, 2023.
