1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-53, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE THE DISABILITY RATING REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN MOTOR 3 VEHICLE AND MOTORCYCLE LICENSE PLATES AND TAGS AUTHORIZED FOR DISABLED VETERANS; TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56.444, MISSISSIPPI CODE 4 5 OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 9 27-19-53. (1) (a) (i) Any legal resident of the State of 10 Mississippi who is a veteran of service in the Armed Forces of the 11 United States, and who is rated as having * * * one hundred 12 percent (100%) permanent service-connected disability or at least eighty percent (80%) nonpermanent service-connected disability by 13 14 the Veterans' Administration or United States Department of 15 Veterans Affairs is privileged to purchase annually under this 16 subsection two (2) motor vehicle license plates or tags in his or her county of legal residence, for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) 17 in total cost for each plate or tag, regardless of make or model 18 of motor vehicle. In order 22 for a person who is rated as having at least eighty percent (80%) 23 nonpermanent service-connected disability to renew a license plate 24 or tag issued under this section, the person must provide an 25 updated benefits letter from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs indicating that the person's rating has not been 26 27 adjusted to less than eighty percent (80%) nonpermanent 28 service-connected disability. 29 (ii) Any legal resident of the State of 30 Mississippi who is a veteran of service in the Armed Forces of the 31 United States, and who is rated as having * * * one hundred 32 percent (100%) permanent service-connected disability or at least 33 eighty percent (80%) nonpermanent service-connected disability by the Veterans' Administration or United States Department of 34 35 Veterans Affairs is privileged to purchase annually under this 36 subsection one (1) motorcycle license plate or tag in his or her county of legal residence, for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) in 37 38 total cost for each plate or tag. The registration year of such 39 motorcycle shall commence the first day of the month in which 40 application for registration is made, as provided in Section 27-19-31. In order for a person who is rated as having at least 41 42 eighty percent (80%) nonpermanent service-connected disability to 43 renew a license plate or tag issued under this section, the person 44 must provide an updated benefits letter from the United States

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45 Department of Veterans Affairs indicating that the person's rating

46 has not been adjusted to less than eighty percent (80%)

(b) Not more than two (2) such motor vehicle license plates or tags shall be issued under this subsection to each such qualified veteran. Not more than one (1) such motorcycle license plate or tag shall be issued under this subsection to each such qualified veteran.

53 (c) This section pertains only to taxes or plates for 54 private passenger motor vehicles or pickup trucks or motorcycles.

(d) Proof of ownership of a particular motor vehicle or motorcycle for which a license plate or tag is requested must be shown at time of application for such plate or tag.

58 Vehicles and motorcycles owned by such veterans are (e) 59 exempt under this subsection from all ad valorem and privilege 60 taxes; however, the surviving spouse of a deceased person who was 61 issued a license plate or tag under this subsection shall be entitled to apply for or retain a license tag issued under this 62 63 subsection and may continue annually to renew registration for two 64 (2) motor vehicle license plates or tags and one (1) motorcycle 65 license plate or tag under this subsection for as long as the 66 spouse remains unmarried. In addition, if a deceased person who 67 was eligible to be issued a license plate or tag under this subsection did not apply for or was not issued a license plate or 68 69 tag, the surviving spouse of such deceased person shall be

At the time of application or 75 renewal registration, a surviving spouse who desires to retain a 76 distinctive plate or tag issued under this subsection shall file 77 with the county tax collector a sworn statement that the spouse is 78 unmarried. Any such vehicle or motorcycle when so registered 79 shall be exempt from all ad valorem and privilege taxes.

80 (2) Any person who is entitled to obtain license tags under 81 subsection (1) of this section may be issued one (1) additional 82 such license tag for any other vehicle registered in his or her 83 name upon payment of the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad 84 valorem taxes and registration fees as otherwise prescribed by law 85 for the particular vehicle.

86 (3) The Department of Revenue is directed to furnish each
87 veteran obtaining a license tag under this section an emblem,
88 which the veteran shall attach securely to the tag, showing that
89 the tag was issued to a disabled American veteran.

90 (4) A license issued under this section shall not be91 transferable to any other person.

92 (5) Any person evading or violating any of the provisions of 93 this section, or attempting to secure benefits under this section 94 to which he is not entitled, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and,

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95 upon conviction, shall be fined not less than One Thousand Dollars 96 (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for not less than 97 ninety (90) days, or both.

98 (6) From and after July 1, 2022, the special tag authorized 99 under this section shall bear the name and emblem of each branch 100 of the United States Armed Forces.

SECTION 2. Section 27-19-56.444, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

103 27-19-56.444. (1) Any legal resident of the State of 104 Mississippi who is a veteran of service in the Armed Forces of the 105 United States and is rated as having service-connected disability 106 by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, but who is 107 not rated as having one hundred percent (100%) permanent 108 service-connected disability or at least eighty percent (80%) nonpermanent service-connected disability by such department, is 109 110 privileged to obtain annually under this section a distinctive 111 license tag for any motor vehicle registered in his name upon payment of the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem taxes 112 113 and registration fees as prescribed by law for private carriers of 114 passengers, pickup trucks and other noncommercial motor vehicles. 115 The distinctive license tag so issued shall be of such color and 116 design as the Department of Revenue may prescribe and shall consist of such letters or numbers, or both, as may be necessary 117 to distinguish each license tag or plate. The registration year 118 119 of such motor vehicle shall commence the first day of the month in
