HOUSE BILL NO. 247

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE BULLETPROOF VESTS REVOLVING FUND PROGRAM 2 TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR LOCAL 3 LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES TO APPLY FOR MONIES NECESSARY FOR THE 4 MATCH REQUIREMENT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE VEST PARTNERSHIP 5 GRANT ACT OF 1998; TO CREATE A SPECIAL FUND IN THE STATE TREASURY 6 TO BE DESIGNATED AS THE BULLETPROOF VESTS REVOLVING FUND; TO 7 SPECIFY THE PURPOSE OF THE BULLETPROOF VEST REVOLVING FUND; TO ESTABLISH THE SCHEDULE TO BE ADHERED TO BY LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT 8 9 AGENCIES WHEN APPLYING FOR FUNDS BASED ON POPULATION; TO PRESCRIBE 10 QUALIFYING CRITERIA FOR ELIGIBILITY OF FUNDS; TO AUTHORIZE THE 11 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EDUCATION TO PROMULGATE ANY RULES AND 12 REGULATIONS NECESSARY FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE BULLETPROOF VESTS 13 REVOLVING FUND PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 15 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is established the Bulletproof Vests 16 Revolving Fund Program to be administered by the Department of 17 Public Safety for the purpose of providing reimbursements to eligible local law enforcement agencies for the purchase of 18 19 bulletproof vests as the fifty percent (50%) federal match requirement of the Department of Justice's Patrick Leahy Federal 20 21 Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant Act of 1998. 22 There is created a special fund in the State Treasury (2)

22 (2) There is created a special fund in the state Treasury23 designated as the Bulletproof Vests Revolving Fund which shall

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24 consist of monies annually appropriated in the amount of Two 25 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) by the Mississippi 26 Legislature and any other monies deposited to the credit of the 27 fund by any other public or private entities. The revolving fund 28 must be maintained in perpetuity for the purposes established in 29 this section. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year may not lapse into the State General Fund, and 30 31 any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to 32 the credit of the fund. Monies in the fund may not be used or 33 expended for any purpose except as authorized under this section. 34 (3) The purpose of the Bulletproof Vests Revolving Fund 35 Program is to provide reimbursement for: 36 The replacement of any bulletproof vest which was (a) 37 purchased on or after July 1, 2000, and is older than five (5) 38 years from the date of the original purchase; 39 (b) The purchase of a bulletproof vest for an 40 individual who had not been issued a bulletproof vest previously by the purchasing law enforcement jurisdiction; 41 42 (C) Officers in receipt of a vest who are classified as 43 full- or part-time sworn law enforcement personnel of state or 44 local police departments, and who have graduated from an 45 accredited law enforcement officers training program recognized by the Department of Public Safety. Certain personnel of other 46

47 agencies within the Department of Public Safety, as determined by48 the Commissioner of Public Safety, may be eligible;

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51 (e) The purchase of vests required to be certified by 52 the National Institute of Justice (NIJ) and on the latest NIJ 53 standards list of American-made vests;

(f) Vests purchased in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 7, Title 31, Mississippi Code of 1972, and the applicant agency's policies and procedures regarding procurement purchases; and

58 (g) Vests that shall remain the property of the59 purchasing local law enforcement agency.

60 (4) (a) Local law enforcement agencies may apply for 61 reimbursement grants from the program fund according to the 62 following schedule:

(i) For fiscal year 2024 and every third fiscal
year thereafter, departments that serve populations less than
fifteen thousand (15,000) may apply;

(ii) For fiscal year 2025 and every third fiscal
year thereafter, departments that serve populations less than
fifty thousand (50,000) but not less than fifteen thousand
(15,000) may apply; and

(iii) For fiscal year 2026 and every third fiscal year thereafter, departments that serve populations greater than fifty thousand (50,000) may apply.

(b) As annual state funding is limited, reimbursement under the Bulletproof Vests Revolving Fund Program is available on a first-come, first-served basis.

(5) (a) To qualify for receipt of funds under this act, each local law enforcement submitting application for matching funds shall:

(i) Have first made application for the first fifty percent (50%) of reimbursement costs through the Patrick Leahy Federal Bulletproof Vest Partnership Program established by the United States Department of Justice to assist in the purchase of bulletproof vests;

84 (ii) Verify that the model type of any bulletproof
85 vest purchased meets the National Institute of Justice
86 requirements for bullet-resistant body armor in effect at the time
87 of the purchase; and

(iii) Submit any documentation required by the
Commissioner of Public Safety to evidence proof of the federal
approval or proof of payment of the federal reimbursement.

91 (b) Any such costs that are not reimbursed through the 92 receipt of funds from the federal grant program shall be awarded 93 to an eligible recipient.

94 (6) The Department of Public Education shall promulgate such
 95 rules and regulations as may be necessary for participation in the
 96 Bulletproof Vests Revolving Fund Program by a local law

97 enforcement agency.
