## HOUSE BILL NO. 257

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-125-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT PHYSICAL THERAPISTS DO NOT NEED TO HAVE PRIOR WORK 3 EXPERIENCE IN ORDER TO WORK AT A PRESCRIBED PEDIATRIC EXTENDED 4 CARE CENTER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 41-125-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

41-125-19. (1) To carry out the intention of the 8 9 Legislature to provide safe and sanitary facilities and healthful 10 programs, the licensing agency shall adopt and publish rules to implement the provisions of this chapter, which shall include 11 12 reasonable and fair standards. Any conflict between these standards and those that may be set forth in local, county or city 13 14 ordinances shall be resolved in favor of those having statewide effect. Those standards shall relate to: 15

(a) The assurance that PPEC services are family
centered and provide individualized medical, developmental and
family training services.

19 (b) The maintenance of PPEC centers, based upon the 20 size of the structure and number of children, relating to plumbing, heating, lighting, ventilation and other building 21 22 conditions, including adequate space, which will ensure the 23 health, safety, comfort and protection from fire of the children 24 served.

The appropriate provisions of the most recent 25 (C) 26 edition of the "Life Safety Code" shall be applied.

27 The number and qualifications of all personnel who (d) 28 have responsibility for the care of the children served.

29 (e) All sanitary conditions within the PPEC center and its surroundings, including water supply, sewage disposal, food 30 31 handling and general hygiene, and maintenance thereof, which will 32 ensure the health and comfort of children served.

33 (f) Programs and basic services promoting and 34 maintaining the health and development of the children served and 35 meeting the training needs of the children's parents or legal guardians. 36

37 Supportive, contracted, other operational and (q) 38 transportation services. However, the licensing agency may not 39 require physical therapists to have prior work experience in order 40 to work at a PPEC center.

41 (h) Maintenance of appropriate medical records, data 42 and information relative to the children and programs. Those

43 records shall be maintained in the facility for inspection by the 44 agency.

45 (2) The licensing agency shall adopt rules to ensure that:
46 (a) No child attends a PPEC center for more than twelve
47 (12) hours within a twenty-four-hour period.

48 (b) No PPEC center provides services other than those49 provided to medically or technologically dependent children.

50 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 51 and after July 1, 2023.
