HOUSE BILL NO. 281

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-9-131, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO AUTHORIZE A BENEFICIARY OF A MUNICIPAL OR COUNTY LAW 3 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY TO RECEIVE THE 4 OFFICER'S SIDEARM; TO BRING FORWARD SECTION 45-3-51, MISSISSIPPI 5 CODE OF 1972, WHICH AUTHORIZES A BENEFICIARY OF A MISSISSIPPI 6 HIGHWAY SAFETY PATROL OFFICER OR AGENT OF THE MISSISSIPPI BUREAU 7 OF NARCOTICS WHO IS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY TO RECEIVE THE OFFICER'S SIDEARM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 45-9-131, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows: 11

12 45-9-131. Upon approval of the governing authority of the municipality or county, a member of any municipal or county law 13 14 enforcement agency who retires under any state retirement system or the *** * *** beneficiary of a law enforcement officer who is 15 16 killed in the line of duty may be allowed to purchase as his or her personal property one (1) sidearm which was issued to the law 17 enforcement officer by the law enforcement agency from which he or 18 19 she retired or by whom he or she was employed at the time of 20 death. 24 SECTION 2. Section 45-3-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 25 brought forward as follows:

26 45-3-51. Each member of the Mississippi Highway Safety 27 Patrol or agent of the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics who retires under the Highway Safety Patrol Retirement System or the Public 28 Employees' Retirement System, for superannuation or for reason of 29 30 disability or a beneficiary of such member of the Highway Safety Patrol or agent of the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics who is 31 32 killed in the line of duty shall be allowed to retain, as his personal property, one (1) sidearm which was issued under 33 34 authority of Section 45-3-19 or 41-29-159. Likewise, a 35 beneficiary of any law enforcement officer killed in the line of duty shall be allowed to retain the officer's sidearm. 36

37 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 38 and after July 1, 2023.
