HOUSE BILL NO. 328

1 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF 2 EMPLOYMENT SECURITY, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING, THE MISSISSIPPI COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD AND THE STATE WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARD TO WORK JOINTLY TO DEVELOP A 3 4 5 PLAN TO BE KNOWN AS THE "CAREER PATHWAYS INITIATIVE"; TO REQUIRE 6 THE INITIATIVE TO INCREASE THE ACCESS OF LOW-INCOME PARENTS AND 7 OTHER INDIVIDUALS TO EDUCATION CREDENTIALS THAT QUALIFY THEM FOR HIGHER-PAYING JOBS IN THEIR LOCAL AREAS, IMPROVE THE PREPAREDNESS 8 9 OF THE MISSISSIPPI WORKFORCE FOR HIGH-SKILL AND HIGH-WAGE JOBS, 10 DEVELOP TRAINING COURSES AND EDUCATIONAL CREDENTIALS AFTER 11 CONSULTING LOCAL EMPLOYERS AND LOCAL WORKFORCE BOARDS TO IDENTIFY 12 APPROPRIATE JOB OPPORTUNITIES AND NEEDED SKILLS AND TRAINING TO 13 MEET EMPLOYERS' NEEDS, PROVIDE RESOURCES ON THE BASIS OF PERFORMANCE INCENTIVES, INCLUDING PARTICIPANTS ENROLLING IN 14 COURSES, COMPLETING THE COURSES, OBTAINING JOBS IN THE TARGETED 15 16 JOB CATEGORIES, AND STAYING EMPLOYED IN THE TARGETED JOB 17 CATEGORIES; TO REQUIRE THE INITIATIVE TO USE AVAILABLE TEMPORARY 18 ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES (TANF) FUNDS FOR PARTICIPANTS WHO 19 HAVE CUSTODY OR LEGAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR A CHILD UNDER TWENTY-ONE 20 YEARS OF AGE AND WHOSE FAMILY INCOME IS LESS THAN TWO HUNDRED 21 FIFTY PERCENT OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL; TO REQUIRE THE BOARD 22 OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING TO CONTRACT 23 TO PROVIDE EDUCATION AND TRAINING THAT WILL RESULT IN JOB TRAINING 24 CERTIFICATES OR HIGHER EDUCATION DEGREES FOR LOW-INCOME ADULTS 25 WITH STATE AGENCIES, TWO-YEAR COLLEGES, LOCAL GOVERNMENTS OR PRIVATE OR COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS; TO AUTHORIZE TANF FUNDS TO BE 26 27 COMBINED WITH OTHER FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL FUNDS IN WAYS 28 CONSISTENT WITH FEDERAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS IN ORDER TO PROVIDE 29 MORE FUNDING FOR THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED 30 PURPOSES.

31 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

## 32 **SECTION 1.** (1) The Legislature finds that:

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33 (a) Higher education credentials are: 34 (i) Becoming increasingly important for the State of Mississippi to maintain a competitive workforce; and 35 36 (ii) Critical for adults to qualify and obtain 37 high-wage employment; and 38 (b) It is in the public interest that: 39 Individuals improve their education (i) 40 credentials in order to qualify for higher-wage jobs; 41 (ii) Eligible persons have access to postsecondary education programs that meet the specific needs of working adults; 42 Institutions of higher education offer 43 (iii) programs targeted to the specific workforce needs of their area 44 45 within the state; and 46 (iv) Our state provides services aimed at 47 improving employment prospects for low-income adults. 48 (2)(a) (i) The Mississippi Department of Employment 49 Security, the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 50 Learning, the Mississippi Community College Board and the State 51 Workforce Investment Board shall work jointly to develop a plan to 52 be known as the "Career Pathways Initiative." 53 (ii) The plan must be updated annually. 54 (b) The initiative must: 55 Increase the access of low-income parents and (i) 56 other individuals to education credentials that qualify them for higher-paying jobs in their local areas; 57

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58 (ii) Improve the preparedness of the Mississippi 59 workforce for high-skill and high-wage jobs; 60 Develop training courses and educational (iii) credentials after consulting local employers and local workforce 61 62 boards to identify appropriate job opportunities and needed skills 63 and training to meet employers' needs; 64 (iv) Provide resources on the basis of performance 65 incentives, including participants: 66 1. Enrolling in courses; 67 Completing the courses; 2. 68 3. Obtaining jobs in the targeted job 69 categories; and 70 4. Staying employed in the targeted job 71 categories; and 72 Use available Temporary Assistance for Needy (V) 73 Families (TANF) funds for participants who have custody or legal 74 responsibility for a child under twenty-one (21) years of age and 75 whose family income is less than two hundred fifty percent (250%) 76 of the federal poverty level. 77 The initiative plan is subject to review, recommendation (3)78 and approval by the State Workforce Investment Board. 79 Under the initiative, the Board of Trustees of State (4) Institutions of Higher Learning shall contract to provide 80 81 education and training that will result in job training

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82 certificates or higher education degrees for low-income adults 83 with:

84 (a) State agencies;

85 (b) Two-year colleges;

86 (c) Local governments; or

87 (d) Private or community organizations.

(5) (a) The initiative plan must specify procedures and
requirements for applications for entry into programs under
subsection (4) of this section.

91 (b) Applications must be made to the Board of Trustees92 of State Institutions of Higher Learning.

93 (6) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher
94 Learning shall determine which two-year college proposals are
95 funded under the initiative.

96 (7) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funds may
97 be combined with other federal, state and local funds in ways
98 consistent with federal laws and regulations in order to provide
99 more funding for the provisions of this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2023.
