## HOUSE BILL NO. 516

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-1-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DECREASE THE MINIMUM YEARS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT EXPERIENCE REQUIRED TO BE APPOINTED A CONSERVATION OFFICER FROM FIVE YEARS TO TWO YEARS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-1-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 49-1-15. (1) All appointments of conservation officers
- 9 shall be under rules adopted and promulgated by the commission.
- 10 No person shall be appointed from and after July 1, 2001, unless
- 11 he meets the following requirements:
- 12 (a) Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age; and
- 13 (b) Has successfully completed sixty-four (64) semester
- 14 hours at an accredited community college or university or has an
- 15 associate degree from an accredited community college or has
- 16 passed the Law Enforcement Academy and has at least \* \* \* two
- 17 ( \* \* \*2) years experience in law enforcement.
- 18 (2) Each applicant, prior to entering into performance of
- 19 his duties, at the expense of the department, shall attend and

complete an appropriate curriculum in the field of law enforcement 20 21 at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy or 22 other training academy whose curriculum complies with requirements 23 of the Board on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Training. 24 Conservation officers shall, on a periodic basis, be required to 25 successfully complete additional advanced courses in law 26 enforcement in order that they will be properly improved and trained in the modern, technical advances of law enforcement. 27
