HOUSE BILL NO. 516

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-1-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 DECREASE THE MINIMUM YEARS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT EXPERIENCE REQUIRED 3 TO BE APPOINTED A CONSERVATION OFFICER FROM FIVE YEARS TO TWO 4 YEARS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 49-1-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 8 49-1-15. (1) All appointments of conservation officers 9 shall be under rules adopted and promulgated by the commission. No person shall be appointed from and after July 1, 2001, unless 10 he meets the following requirements: 11 12 Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age; and (a) Has successfully completed sixty-four (64) semester 13 (b) 14 hours at an accredited community college or university or has an associate degree from an accredited community college or has 15 passed the Law Enforcement Academy and has at least \* \* \* two 16 17 ( \* \* \*2) years experience in law enforcement. complete an appropriate curriculum in the field of law enforcement 20 21 at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy or 22 other training academy whose curriculum complies with requirements 23 of the Board on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Training. Conservation officers shall, on a periodic basis, be required to 24 25 successfully complete additional advanced courses in law 26 enforcement in order that they will be properly improved and trained in the modern, technical advances of law enforcement. 27 28 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 29 and after July 1, 2023.
