HOUSE BILL NO. 551

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-13-77, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON WHO IS A RESIDENT OF THE STATE, A 3 LICENSED PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER AND HAS A SPECIFIC RECORD OF TWO 4 YEARS OF QUALIFYING SURVEYING EXPERIENCE SHALL BE QUALIFIED FOR 5 LICENSURE AS A PROFESSIONAL SURVEYOR; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
