HOUSE BILL NO. 589

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-2-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT WHENEVER A DEATH BENEFIT IS PAID TO THE SURVIVORS OR THE ESTATE OF A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR FIREFIGHTER UNDER CERTAIN FEDERAL LAWS, THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY SHALL MAKE A PAYMENT FROM THE STATE DEATH BENEFITS TRUST FUND TO THE SURVIVORS OR THE ESTATE OF THE PERSON WITHOUT MAKING ITS OWN DETERMINATION ABOUT THE PERSON'S CAUSE OF DEATH; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 45-2-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 45-2-1. (1) Whenever used in this section, the term:
- 12 (a) "Covered individual" means a law enforcement
- 13 officer or firefighter, including volunteer firefighters, as
- 14 defined in this section when employed by an employer as defined in
- 15 this section; it does not include employees of independent
- 16 contractors.
- 17 (b) "Employer" means a state board, commission,
- 18 department, division, bureau or agency, or a county, municipality
- 19 or other political subdivision of the state, which employs,

20 appoints or otherwise engages the services of covered individuals.

21 ((C)	"Firefighter"	means	an	individual	who	is	trained
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- 22 for the prevention and control of loss of life and property from
- 23 fire or other emergencies, who is assigned to firefighting
- 24 activity, and is required to respond to alarms and perform
- 25 emergency actions at the location of a fire, hazardous materials
- 26 or other emergency incident.
- 27 (d) "Law enforcement officer" means any lawfully sworn
- 28 officer or employee of the state or any political subdivision of
- 29 the state whose duties require the officer or employee to
- 30 investigate, pursue, apprehend, arrest, transport or maintain
- 31 custody of persons who are charged with, suspected of committing,
- 32 or convicted of a crime, whether the officer is on regular duty on
- 33 full-time status, an auxiliary or reserve officer, or is serving
- 34 on a temporary or part-time status.
- 35 (e) "Cause of death" means any cause of death that
- 36 would be covered under the Public Safety Officers' Benefits Act of
- 37 1976, the Hometown Heroes Survivors Benefits Act of 2003,
- 38 generally codified at 42 USCS Chapter 46, or the Safeguarding
- 39 America's First Responders Act of 2020.
- 40 (2) (a) The Department of Public Safety shall make a
- 41 payment, as provided in this section, in the amount of One Hundred
- 42 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) when a covered individual, while
- 43 engaged in the performance of the person's official duties, dies
- 44 or receives accidental or intentional bodily injury that results
- 45 in the loss of the covered individual's life and such death is the

- 46 result of a covered cause of death, provided that the death is not
- 47 the result of suicide and that the bodily injury is not
- 48 intentionally self-inflicted. Whenever a death benefit is paid to
- 49 the survivors or the estate of a covered individual under any of
- 50 the federal laws named in subsection (1)(e) of this section, the
- 51 cause of death of the covered individual shall be deemed to meet
- 52 the definition in subsection (1)(e), and the Department of Public
- 53 Safety shall make the payment provided for in this subsection to
- 54 the survivors or the estate of the covered individual without
- 55 making its own determination about the covered individual's cause
- of death.
- 57 (b) The payment provided for in this subsection shall
- 58 be made to the beneficiary who was designated in writing by the
- 59 covered individual, signed by the covered individual and delivered
- 60 to the employer during the covered individual's lifetime. If no
- 61 such designation is made, then the payment shall be made to the
- 62 surviving child or children and spouse in equal portions, and if
- 63 there is no surviving child or spouse, then to the parent or
- 64 parents. If a beneficiary is not designated and there is no
- 65 surviving child, spouse or parent, then the payment shall be made
- 66 to the covered individual's estate.
- 67 (c) The payment made in this subsection is in addition
- 68 to any workers' compensation or pension benefits and is exempt
- 69 from the claims and demands of creditors of the covered
- 70 individual.

71	(3) (a) There is established in the State Treasury a
72	special fund to be known as the Law Enforcement Officers and Fire
73	Fighters Death Benefits Trust Fund. The trust fund shall be
74	funded by an initial appropriation of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
75	(\$200,000.00), and shall be comprised of any additional funds made
76	available by the Legislature or by donation, contribution, gift or
77	any other source.

- 78 (b) The State Treasurer shall invest the monies of the 79 trust fund in any of the investments authorized for the funds of 80 the Public Employees' Retirement System under Section 25-11-121, 81 and those investments shall be subject to the limitations 82 prescribed by Section 25-11-121.
 - (c) Unexpended amounts remaining in the trust fund at the end of the state fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any income earned on amounts in the trust fund shall be deposited to the credit of the trust fund. However, any unexpended amounts transferred in accordance with Section 2 of Chapter 315, Laws of 2022, and remaining in the trust fund at the end of the state fiscal year shall lapse into the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund.
- 91 (4) The Department of Public Safety shall be responsible for 92 the management of the trust fund and the disbursement of death 93 benefits authorized under this section. The Department of Public 94 Safety shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to implement 95 and standardize the payment of death benefits under this section,

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- 96 to administer the trust fund created by this section and to carry 97 out the purposes of this section.
- 98 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 99 and after its passage.
