1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1, CHAPTER 109, LAWS OF 2022, TO
2 REVISE THE RECIPIENT OF ONE PROJECT FUNDED BY THE MISSISSIPPI
3 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY FROM THE GULF COAST RESTORATION FUND; TO
4 REVISE THE FISCAL YEAR 2023 APPROPRIATION TO THE MISSISSIPPI
5 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (MDA) TO INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF FUNDS
6 APPROPRIATED FROM THE GULF COAST RESTORATION FUND TO ASSIST THE
7 HANCOCK COUNTY PORT AND HARBOR COMMISSION WITH THE TECHNOLOGY PARK
8 AT STENNIS AIRPORT BY THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FUNDS REMOVED FROM OTHER
9 MDA APPROPRIATIONS AS PROVIDED IN THIS ACT; TO AMEND SECTION 2,
10 CHAPTER 109, LAWS OF 2022, TO REVISE THE FISCAL YEAR 2023
11 APPROPRIATION TO THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TO REMOVE
12 THE FUNDS REAPPROPRIATED FROM THE GULF COAST RESTORATION FUND TO
13 ASSIST THE HANCOCK COUNTY PORT AND HARBOR COMMISSION WITH THE
14 ASSAULT LANDING STRIP; TO AMEND SECTION 3, CHAPTER 109, LAWS OF
15 2022, TO REVISE THE FISCAL YEAR 2023 APPROPRIATION TO THE
16 MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TO REMOVE THE FUNDS
17 REAPPROPRIATED FROM THE GULF COAST RESTORATION FUND TO ASSIST THE
18 HANCOCK COUNTY PORT AND HARBOR COMMISSION WITH THE MULTIUSER AERO
19 STRIP AT STENNIS AIRPORT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

21 **SECTION 1.** Section 1, Chapter 109, Laws of 2022, is amended
22 as follows:

23 Section 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
24 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
25 Gulf Coast Restoration Fund, as created in Section 57-119-1
26 Mississippi Code of 1972, not otherwise appropriated to the



27 Mississippi Development Authority. These funds are provided for
28 projects as outlined in Section 57-119-9, Mississippi Code of
29 1972, for assistance to local units of government, nongovernmental
30 organizations, institutions of higher learning, community
31 colleges, ports, airports, public-private partnerships, private
32 for-profit entities, private nonprofit entities and local economic
33 development entities for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022,
34 and ending June 30, 2023

87 Restoration Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Mississippi
88 Development Authority for the purpose of reauthorizing the
89 expenditure of Gulf Coast Restoration Fund, as authorized in
90 Senate Bill No. 2951, 2021 Regular Session, for the fiscal year
91 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023

143 Section 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
144 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Gulf Coast
145 Restoration Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Mississippi
146 Development Authority for the purpose of reauthorizing the
147 expenditure of Gulf Coast Restoration Fund, as authorized in



148 Senate Bill No. 2951, 2021 Regular Session, for the fiscal year
149 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
