HOUSE BILL NO. 823

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE COMMISSION ON EDUCATION AND ECONOMIC COMPETITIVENESS TO DEVELOP A VISION FOR MISSISSIPPI'S FUTURE ECONOMY AND CONSIDER HOW TO REFORM EDUCATION TO PREPARE ALL STUDENTS FOR THAT FUTURE; TO DEVELOP INITIAL LEGISLATIVE 5 RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE 2024 LEGISLATIVE SESSION; TO DEVELOP OMNIBUS LEGISLATION TO INTRODUCE DURING THE 2025 LEGISLATIVE 7 SESSION; TO ESTABLISH COLLABORATIVE PARTNERSHIPS BETWEEN MISSISSIPPI'S EARLY CHILDHOOD, K-12, HIGHER EDUCATION AND 8 9 WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SYSTEMS INTO A WORLD-CLASS SYSTEM THAT 10 PREPARES ALL STUDENTS FOR SUCCESS IN WORK AND LIFE BY ADDRESSING CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION, CURRICULUM AND ASSESSMENT, 11 12 FOUNDATIONS OF SUPPORT, AND GOVERNANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY TO SUPPORT THIS SYSTEM; TO DEVELOP A PLAN FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROPOSED OMNIBUS LEGISLATION; TO APPROPRIATE FUNDING TO PROCURE 14 THE SELECTION OF A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED ORGANIZATION WITH 15 16 EXPERTISE IN INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION BENCHMARKING, FACILITATION, 17 AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT AND EXTENSIVE EXPERIENCE WITH 18 MISSISSIPPI'S EDUCATION SYSTEM TO FACILITATE THE COMMISSION'S 19 MEETINGS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 21 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is established an independent 22 research-based Commission on Education and Economic 23 Competitiveness, which shall assess and provide: 24 (a) A vision for education and workforce development

- Recommendations for omnibus legislation for the 40 41 2025 Regular Session of the Mississippi Legislature, to address 42 those recommendations presented to the Legislature in 2024; and A plan for beginning and overseeing the initial 43 (f)
- 44 phases of implementation of the legislation.
- 45 (2) The commission shall select a national consulting (a) 46 and professional learning organization with expertise in 47 internationally benchmarking the policies and practices of 48 high-performing education systems and translating those policies and practices into United States contexts to facilitate the 49 50 commission.

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124	(4) (a) Appointments shall be made within thirty (30) days
125	after the effective date of this act. The commission shall hold
126	its first meeting before August 1, 2023. The Chairmen of the House
127	and Senate Education Committees shall serve as the inaugural
128	co-chairmen of the commission, thereafter the Chairmen of the
129	House and Senate Workforce Development Committees shall serve as
130	co-chairmen for the immediate successive year, followed by the
131	Chairmen of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees serving
132	as co-chairman for the third year of the commission's
133	establishment. Beyond the first three (3) years, the designation
134	of the commission's co-chairmen shall repeat the same cycle of
135	service, however the Vice Chairmen of the respective House and

- 137 A majority of the members of the commission shall 138 constitute a quorum. In the adoption of the rules, resolutions 139 and reports, an affirmative vote of a majority of the members 140 shall be required. All members shall be notified in writing of all meetings, such notices shall be mailed at least five (5) days 141 142 before the date on which a meeting is to be held.
- 143 (C) The commission shall conclude its business no later 144 than June 30, 2027, and shall be dissolved on July 1, 2027.
- 145 The commission may choose to conduct its business by dividing into subcommittees, and, at the discretion of the 146 commission's chairman, appoint additional members with relevant 147 148 expertise to the subcommittees.

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Senate Committees shall serve as co-chairmen.

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149	(6) Members of the commission shall receive no compensation
150	for their service on the commission, but may receive reimbursement
151	for mileage and actual expenses as provided in Section 25-3-41, to
152	the extent that funds are available for that purpose.

- 153 (7) To effectuate the purposes of this section, any
 154 department, division, board, bureau, committee or agency of the
 155 state or any political subdivision thereof, shall, at the request
 156 of any member of the commission, provide such facilities,
 157 assistance, information and data as will enable the committee to
 158 properly carry out its duties.
- SECTION 2. All costs and expenses incurred by the Commission on Education and Economic Competitiveness in procuring the selection of a national consulting and professional learning organization shall be paid out of any funds which are made available upon appropriation by the Legislature.
- SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2023.
