HOUSE BILL NO. 920

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO CLARIFY HOW POPULATION IS CALCULATED FOR AUTHORIZED USE OF 3 RADAR SPEED DETECTION EQUIPMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 63-3-519. It shall be unlawful for any person or peace 7 officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway 8 9 Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of 10 radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or 11 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used: 12 By municipal law enforcement officers within a municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more 13 14 according to the latest or a previous federal census or having a 15 population of two thousand (2,000) or more upon the public streets 16 of the municipality, but in no case where the latest federal census population for the municipality is less than one thousand 17 18 five hundred (1,500);

- (c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand (15,000) according to the latest federal census on federally designated highways lying within the corporate limits.
- The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol shall be immediately notified by municipal law enforcement of any road blockages or emergencies occurring on any federally designated limited-access highways lying within the corporate limits.
- 30 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 31 and after July 1, 2023.
